NON-VERBAL COMMUNICATION

- Seeing and receiving wordless messages
- Expresses more of a meaning than verbal communication
- Understanding the message
 - 7% by spoken word
 - 38% by the tone of voice
 - 55% by body language

Types of Non-Verbal Communication

- Eye contact
- Touch
- Body language and posture
- Gestures
- Facial expressions
- Object communication such as clothing and hairstyles
 - Healthy people usually pay more attention to dress
 - People who are feeling ill show much less interest
 - Health care workers neat and clean uniform

FORMS OF NONVERBAL COMMUNICATION

- Oculesics
 - Eye communication (ocular)
- Haptics
 - Study of touch (body to body contact; hug, high five, fist bump, handshake)
- Vocalics/paralanguage
 - How you use your voice; tone, pitch, pace, volume, pauses/silence

FORMS OF NONVERBAL COMMUNICATION

- Kinesics
 - Body movement, gestures, facial expressions
- Proxemics
 - Proximity; spacial distance between you and others
- Artifactual
 - Item we put on ourselves to define who we are

ASSIGNMENT FORMAT

- Report needs to be typed double spaced, must include headings (Introduction, Experiment, etc) that are flush to the left, by itself, and bold italicized
 - *Introduction* (1 paragraph)- standard, attention grabber, thesis, preview
 - *Experiment* (1-2 paragraphs)- What are you going to do, where you going to go, what form are you studying, what are you going to do with that form, who are you to do it to, etc.
 - Prediction!!!
 - Results (1 paragraph)- relate what you saw
 - Group people together if there are similar responses don't write about each person individually; example positive/negative/outcasters
 - *Discussion* (2-3 paragraphs)- Answer why? Analyze.
 - Address prediction
 - Conclusion (1 paragraph)
