





By keeping detailed and organized notes, you'll be well-prepared to create a compelling documentary and develop valuable investigative skills.

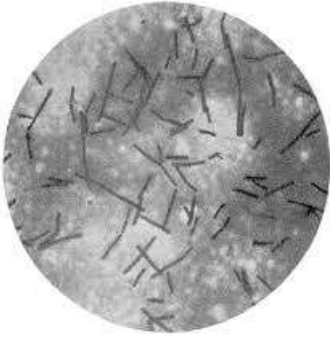

Theories (Lesson 3 & 6)

Three Theories of Yellow Fever Transmission (Sub Unit 2- Lesson 3)

Bacteria (*Bacillus icteroides*)



- Dr. Giuseppe Sanarelli stated yellow fever spreads through bacteria
- This bacteria actually causes hog cholera
- Four doctors tried to find traces of BI in both alive and dead patients
- The doctors did NOT find that BI caused Yellow Fever

Contamination through items



- This theory states that yellow fever is spread through clothing, bedding, and furniture
- No scientist had proven this to be true
- This theory was proven discredited when the prisoners did not also get sick

Spread through mosquitoes



- Dr. Finlay's theory
- The experiments were unsuccessful
- After Lazear's experiments- this theory was proven correct
- Has to bite human with yellow fever within 3 days
- It has to bite a human within 7 to 17 days

Camp Columbia (Lesson 6)

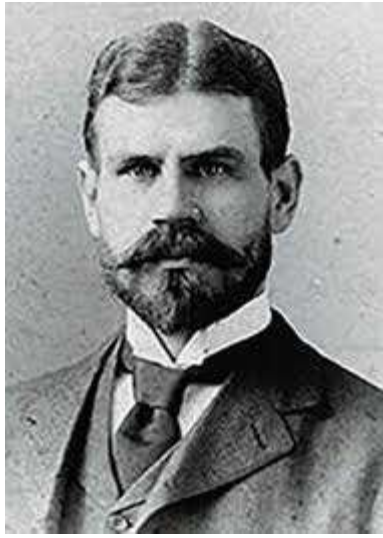


What happened in Camp Columbia to narrow down the theories to just one?

- BI was proven to not be the way yellow fever is transmitted
- The prisoner died of yellow fever but none of his cell mates did, which proves it was not through contamination
