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History Tellers Project

In an interdisciplinary project that combined research and storywriting skills, Team 7-6 learned firsthand how challenging it is to be an historical fiction writer. The "History Tellers Project" spanned several weeks as the students worked in the library and computer lab researching a particular event from the seventh grade social studies' timeline. First, students had to choose an event and setting that interested them. Ms. Maher and Ms. Sandberg helped students narrow down topics and provided historical expertise for the project. After learning how to access resource information, students—aided by

Ms. Mjos and Mrs. Dougherty wrote an original historical fiction story combining historical facts



and fiction writing to capture a moment in history. Stories had to incorporate essential elements of fiction, including: characterization, conflict, plot, dialogue, setting,

climax and theme. Mini-lessons such as writing effective and correctly punctuated dialogue helped students problem-solve how to combine history and fiction. After hours of writing, editing, and lastminute research, students walked away with original stories that would make John Jakes proud! From the Salem witch trials to the War of 1812 to the Battle of Gettysburg, students brought to life original tales of America's past. Students shared excerpts with their classmates and reflected on all they learned during the project, which culminated with an Author's Tea celebrating the students' efforts.

Ten Resolutions for Parents in 2005

- 1. Come together for a family meal as many times a week as possible. Let the answering machine do its job and make sure the TV is off.
- Notice the small steps and the good efforts your child makes. Don't overvalue the final product, which can serve to discourage a child from trying.
- 3. Apply this same generous attitude toward yourself and other family members.
- Avoid asking too many questions. Questions often make children feel quizzed, attacked and/or invaded. Make statements and observations instead.
- 5. Listen carefully to your children. Try to understand where they are coming from what are their wishes and concerns and how it is that they see a situation.
- 6. Be clear in your own mind what are your expectations. Then let children know clearly and calmly, in advance whenever possible, what these expectations are.
- 7. Promote laughter with your child. Have fun and good times in the family. Cultivate your own sense of humor.
- 8. Pay attention to each other. FOCUS. Listen with both ears and let your children know when you can't listen or pay attention to them.
- Beware of overscheduling and filling every minute with "productive" activity. Create blocks of time for just hanging out and being there. These are the times that children will remember with fondness.
- 10. Make time for the things that give YOU pleasure that nurture and nourish you mentally, physically and emotionally. Your well-being is crucial to your family.

Happiness and Life Satisfaction in Children and Adolescents, by Dr. Jeffrey Froh, Candlewood Psychologist

Negative symptomology (e.g., anxiety and depression) and positive psychological health (e.g., happiness and life satisfaction) operate independently of each other. That is, the absence of social-emotional difficulty does not equate to optimal functioning. Research continues to show that happiness is both a protective factor against emotional maladies (e.g., stress, and depression) and a predictor of a high quality of life (e.g., positive and supportive relationships, goal attainment, and good overall health).

To this end, a lesson plan focusing on happiness and life satisfaction was created. The objective was for the students to gain a self-awareness of their current level of self-reported life satisfaction, as well-

as to learn specific strategies for the enhancement of life satisfaction. My ultimate goal is to foster the positive psychological health of all of our students. As such, I am currently increasing my knowledge base so as to create other positive psychology lesson plans (i.e., forgiveness, gratitude, meaning, hope and optimism).



The teachers of team 7-5 extend their sincere thanks and appreciation for the help of the students and parents during our tsunami relief effort. BLACK HISTORY MONTH

In honor of Black History month, Candlewood's Team 7-6 recognized the achievements of several African-Americans who contributed to the Civil Rights Movement in America. In Ms. Mjos's and Mrs. Dougherty's English classes, students were asked what qualities successful people shared. Then students read excerpts from the autobiographies of Malcolm X and Jackie Robinson. We envisioned Malcolm X fighting against his own lack of education as he used a dictionary to teach himself how to read. We pictured the tremendous obstacles that enabled Jackie Robinson to become the first African-American major league baseball player to play on an integrated league. Students compared and contrasted the qualities that enabled these pioneers to become role models and leaders in the Civil Rights movement. Students compared and contrasted views of Malcolm X to those of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s views about how to achieve equality for all people. Students also read and closely analyzed Dr. King's "I Have a Dream" speech, paying close attention to Dr. King's mastery of persuasive language. Finally, students were asked to write whether they believed Dr. King's dream had finally come true and what they would do personally to achieve that dream. Goals for the unit were not just to learn more about these African-American heroes, but to be able to read, write, listen, and speak about them clearly and expressively.
