FACILITY IMPROVEMENTS

During the summer of 2007, many facility improvement projects were accomplished in the District. These projects were completed with the usage of the district's Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL), School Infrastructure Local Option Tax (SILO) and funds provided by the Worth County Development Authority (WCDA). A listing of the projects and costs are as follows.

ICAM 2007

Iowa Collaborative Assessment Module Report

Northwood –Kensett 11th grade students were assessed with work-related mathematics problems (ICAM) last spring.

The ICAM assessment consists of a total of eight multiple-choice questions and four open ended questions. Students were asked to solve work related math problems using a variety of mathematical concepts and computations; twenty points were possible on the assessment.


All juniors enrolled at N-K were required to take the ICAM. 85% of the 40 juniors were proficient. The proficiency this past spring went up from the previous spring with scored 82%, this is lower than 2005 in which we had our high proficiency level of 91.45%. This is that last year that ICAM's will be used as an assessment in math, we will start collecting data from our MAP testing done school wide.

The N-K PTO meeting was held on September 10, 2007 in the N-K Elementary conference room at 7pm. 7 members were present. Administration member present was Mr. Costello. Teacher present was Diane Hanson.

The treasurer's report was reviewed. Motion to approve the report from Pam Meyer, second by Heidi Rebelein, motion carried.

The Secretary's report was reviewed from the March meeting. Motion to approve the meeting minutes by Renate Tenold, second by Pam Meyer, motion carried.

Discussion was held that a formal "Thank you" should be written to the WCDA for the \$10,000 the PTO received towards the elementary playground project. Greetings from the Counselor's office at N-K. Numerous activities occupy the calendar in the guidance office so far this year. Oct. 17 was the test date for the PSAT (National Merit Test). Sophomores and Juniors participated in this activity. On Oct. 17. the Iowa College Access Network will be presenting tips for college to parents and students in grades 11 and 12.

On November 7 the sophomores will be taking the PLAN test offered by the ACT testing corporation in preparation for their high school and post-high school planning. This assessment is being paid from WCDA funds and will aid every sophomore in making future career decisions.

In February the military will offer the ASVAB test to all juniors. This is an important test because it assesses talents and skills that are not often measured in our public school systems.

The counselor web page is now up and in operation. We are yet working on several aspects of the page so it is far from complete. Check the ACT link to find the testing dates for the remainder of the year.

HEART SAVER CPR PROGRAM AVAILABLE FREE OF CHARGE TO PARENTS OF CHILDREN AGE 0-5 IN WORTH COUNTY

Worth County Public Health has been awarded funding through Empowerment to provide CPR certification to parents of 0-5 year olds living in Worth County. The American Red Cross "Heart Saver" CPR will be offered to the parents at no charge. This is a one time session for parents to participate in. The session will be up to 4 hours in length depending on the number of questions by participants. We are taking names of adults who will be interested in the training. This will be provided on a first come first serve basis. Once we have enough participants for a class, sessions will be scheduled. Please contact Worth County

Children will be in a safer environment when parents have knowledge through completion of the Heart Saver CPR program. Many victims of sudden cardiac arrest have ventricular fibrillation (VF). VF is an abnormal, chaotic heart rhythm that prevents the heart from pumping blood. The only treatment for VF is defibrillation. Defibrillation is a shock that stops VF and allows a normal heart rhythm to resume. When VF is present, prompt defibrillation will increase the victim's chance of survival. With each minute that defibrillation is delayed during cardiac arrest caused by VF, the victim's chance of survival is reduced by 7% to 10%. If defibrillation is provided within the first 5 minutes of a VF cardiac arrest, the victim's chance of survival is about 50%. After 10 to 12 minutes of cardiac arrest there is a very little chance of a successful rescue **unless CPR has been provided.** CPR prolongs the time that defibrillation can be effective, increasing the "window of opportunity" for resuscitation. To increase the victim's chance of survival, you must provide CPR until the defibrillator arrives. Source:

Fall is here and school is back in full swing. In late October, staff and Jr. High/Senior students are scheduled for flu shots. As of now, there have been few illnesses, but cold months are ahead. One of the best ways to prevent sickness is hand washing.

Now that school has started, it is a good habit to check your children for lice weekly. Look for white or yellow-brown specks, "nits" that are not easily removed. Dandruff can easily be brushed off of hair. Lice are tiny black specks. They may move. Check your child's entire scalp. Spots to pay special attention to are the back of the head and around ears.

Watch for signs and symptoms. Extreme itching is the main sign, causing inability to concentrate. Lice can be treated with a lice treatment shampoo. It is important to follow instructions on shampoo bottle carefully. Remind children not to share combs, brushes, hair accessories, or hats.

RSVP programs cost \$100-\$150 per student at no cost to your school district & are making a difference in the lives of children in north Iowa. During the 2006-07 school year, more than **200 volunteers** touched the lives of nearly **400 children** throughout **11 school districts.** RSVP, which has been ranked in the top 2 percent out of 755 RSVP programs throughout the nation, coordinates 5 programs in Cerro Gordo, Hancock, Winnebago and Worth counties.

The programs include:

- Breakfast Buddies: Breakfast Buddies add conversation to the breakfast menu by talking with students and using active listening skills. Last year, 100 percent of the 56 students involved in the mentoring program showed progress in academic performance.
- **Reading Buddies:** Reading Buddies is a one-on-one reading assistance program for elementary students. Last year, nearly **96 percent** of the **218 elementary students** in the Reading Buddies program improved their reading scores by **0.5 grade level or more.**
- **Reading Coaches:** Reading Coaches develop a mentoring relationship with middle school students and utilize the "Six Traits of Reading" strategies as they assist the struggling readers. Last year, teachers reported **80 percent** of the **96 students** who met with Reading Coaches improved by **0.5 grade level or more.**
- **Conversation Partners:** Conversation Partners engage new international students at Waldorf College in English conversation.
- Academic Coaches: Academic Coaches assist Waldorf College students who are struggling in class. Mary Graham, Marketing Coordinator


