Hello everyone,

I wanted to dedicate this newsletter to the topic of school facilities. Based on my conversations with people in this community I think it is fair to say that school facilities are a high priority. School facilities have been identified over and over again as an important topic in my collection of information to develop the Strategic Operating Plan. When Heart and Soul collected information from the community on priorities, school facilities were indicated by our community as the most important issue facing our community.



In July 2017 we assembled a school facility committee to investigate options and give "Big Picture" feedback to the school board. The school facility committee has met five times so far and we have been discussing facts about our facilities. I wanted to share some of those facts with you because we need people to begin discussing our school facilities.

FACT #1: Every school facility (except the district office) has issues that need to be addressed. Shannon, Carpenter, Middle School, High School, and the Bus Barn all have substantial work that has to be done.

FACT #2: In 2012, FEH Associates Inc., an architect/engineering firm, did a facility needs assessment that included Shannon, Carpenter, Middle School, and the Bus Barn. They discovered that to repair and bring those facilities up to ADA standards it would cost the district \$20.3 million dollars. This included a small addition at Shannon and Carpenter but did not include any of the work needed at the High School. This Assessment was done five years ago and the prices will have increased.

FACT #3: This fact seems to surprise people. We are a district that is debt free!!! Our last General Obligation Bond for the high school was paid off in 2016.

FACT #4: One theme that has become very obvious as I did my research on bonds in Monticello was that during the 80's, 90's, and 00's school boards and the community supported the idea of creating a "Central Campus" plan. This plan would put the elementary, middle school, and high school together on one campus. The students would not necessarily be in the same buildings but located in the same general area. A "Central Campus" plan would create some opportunities for efficiency in our school district in several areas.

FACT #5: The school board has asked me to put out a Request For Proposal (RFP) and the school board will be interviewing Architectural/Engineering Firms on November 8th at the next school board work session. The school board will be voting on November 27th to select a firm to work with.

FACT #6: Construction prices will continue to rise each year and building costs raise between 4%-6% annually. If we do nothing to our facilities at this time the costs for future projects are growing faster than we can save money, so we will only be forced to borrow more in the future.

These are the facts we have been discussing at our Facility Committee meetings and the facts our community should be discussing. There is no doubt that whatever decision we make it is going to cost a substantial amount. I wish there was a different solution but there is not. So I ask you, when it comes to facility improvements....WHY NOT US?....WHY NOT NOW?

I would love to hear your thoughts so I can share them with the Facility Committee. Please feel free to send me an email or give me a call at anytime. Thank you for your continued support of the Monticello Community School District.

High School Students Interested in NCAA Sports

Here is a guick overview of the NCAA Eligibility Center process to help guide student-athletes and ensure they are ready for college sports. Students are responsible for maintaining their academics throughout high school. These tips will help keep them on track for meeting academic initial-eligibility standards:

Grade 9

 Students work with their counselor to ensure they take appropriate NCAA core courses.

Grade 10

• Students register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org.

Grade 11

- Students work with their school counselor to ensure they will graduate on time with the required number of NCAA core courses.
- · Students take the ACT or SAT and submit their scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Students ask their counselor to upload their official transcript to the NCAA Eligibility Center at the end of the year.

- · Students complete last NCAA core courses.
- · Students take the ACT or SAT again, if necessary, and submit their scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center using code 9999.
- Students should apply to the school of their choosing and confirm they have been accepted.
- · Students request final amateurism certification beginning April 1 before enrolling in college in the fall.
- Students ask their counselor to upload their final official transcript with proof of graduation to the NCAA Eligibility Center.

Dan Sauser 2017 Recipient of IGHSAU Cross Country Golden Plaque Award

Monticello's Dan Sauser is the 2017 cross country recipient of the Iowa Girls' High School Athletic Union's Golden Plaque of Distinction Award. Dan will be awarded honored Saturday in a presentation at the 2017 State Cross Country meet at the conclusion of the Class 2A girls' race

The IGHSAU's Golden Plaque of Distinction Award honors the lowa coach who has demonstrated a successful career while making notable contributions toward school, community and the coaching profession.

Sauser has been the head coach for both the girls and boys cross country teams at Monticello since 2004. During his coaching

tenure, his teams have won 19 conference championships. At the state level, his teams have won four boys class 2A state cross country championships and the Panther girls have won two Class 2A state titles. In addition to the six titles, Sauser's teams have three state runner-up finishes, three third place finishes and 17 of his 21 state qualifying teams have placed in the top five.

Coach Sauser has collected numerous coaching honors throughout his coaching career. He has been named the IATC State Coach of the Year six times and the northeast lowa Coach of the Year nine times. Sauser is currently a member of the Cross Country Advisory Committee.

Dan has been married to his wife Donna for 22 years. They have three children, Nathan, Ella and the late Kyle Sauser. He is a graduate of the University of lowa and teaches mathematics at Monticello High School and Kirkwood's Jones Regional Educational Center.
