DUAL CREDIT

Students who are interested in taking classes for dual credit and qualify for free or reduced lunches (does NOT mean they need to eat here) can register for dual credit class(es) in the fall and/or spring and have the credits paid for by the ND College Access Network (NDCAN). Free Application for Federal Student Aid

Available as of October 1, 2022. parents, guardians, and

students may use their federal income tax returns from 2022, before January 1, 2023. Income will interface on FAFSA after 2022 taxes are completed. The online application is FREE at https://fsaid.ed.gov. A username and password will be created and used as your online application signature. The automatic ND State Grant of up to \$1,100 per semester, based on financial need, is now based on first come-first serve FAFSA completion.

North Dakota State Scholarship

The \$6,000.00 scholarship is available at approved colleges and universities in the state of North Dakota. Students may use this scholarship a total of eight semesters over the course of six years. Students receive \$1,500.00 per year (\$750.00 per semester).

To qualify for the state scholarship, an ACT score of 24 is required, or three WorkKeys test scores of "5" or higher.

The three WorkKeys tests are <u>Applied Math, Graphic</u>

<u>Literacy</u>, and <u>Workplace Documents</u>. More information regarding dates, places, and times these tests will be offered is coming soon!

SENIORS: If you were not happy with your ACT score, or are just looking to improve it, you still have time to retake the test! Your highest score will be the one that counts for college admission and scholarships. Pick up a paper practice booklet with any counselor or practice online. There are also ACT flashcards that can be checked out from the library.

NCAA Eligibility Center
--This online application checks academic eligibility for students who want to play sports at a Division I or Division II college/university. Once complete, be sure to have your official transcript sent from the front office; have them send another one at the end of the school year as well.

College/University Visits
--(Juniors and seniors) Take the time and schedule a college visit!
Many colleges/universities have open houses and tours for prospective students; check with the college's website or a college representative for special activities/events. Stop in and see your high school counselor if you need help making contact.

Pre-ACT Testing -- The PreACT is a paper-and-pencil test comprised of multiple-choice sections for English, Math, Reading, and Science. (Unlike the official ACT exam, the PreACT does not have an essay section.) The PreACT also contains information designed to aid in discussions about college majors and career paths. Although many schools are not currently using ACT scores for general admission, MOST are still requiring and using them for college class placement, determining scholarship recipients, and specific program admission.

Test Anxiety-Testing provides a healthy challenge for students and helps them measure what they have learned. Teens have grown up in an era of high-stakes standardized testing. Finals time at the end of each grading period can be stressful for both parents and students. Schools are also ranked according to their students' standardized test scores. Students should get plenty of rest and have a good breakfast before testing.

In conjunction with DSU, a FAFSA/Financial Aid Night will be hosted in order to help parents and students (seniors and juniors who plan to early grad) start the financial aid process. This will be held on November 9, 2022, and will take place in Beck Auditorium in Kleinfelter Hall @ DSU. If you plan to attend, please bring your Chromebook with so that we can help get you started ©
