ND State Scholarship

The \$6,000 scholarship is available at approved colleges and universities in the state of ND. Students may use this scholarship a total of eight semesters over the course of six years. Students receive \$1,500 per year (\$750 per semester).

FAFSA



As we approach the college application season, it's crucial for our high school seniors to understand the importance of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) for the 2025-26 academic year. Completing the FAFSA is a vital step in securing financial aid for college, and we want to ensure you have all the information you need to get started!

How to Create Your StudentAid.gov Account (FSA ID)

Creating your StudentAid.gov account (FSA ID) is the first step in completing your FAFSA. Here's how to do it:

- 1. Visit the Website: Go to https://studentaid.gov.
- 2. Select 'Create Account': Click on the "Create Account" button
- 3. Provide Your Information: Fill in the required information, including your name, personal email address, and Social Security Number. You'll have only one StudentAid.gov account to use for the rest of your life, so make sure to use an email address that you'll have access to even after you graduate from school or change jobs.
- 4.**Set Up Your Username and Password:** Choose a secure username and passward you will remember.
- 5. **Verify Your Email:** Check your email for a verification link and follow the instruction to verify your account.
- 6. **Complete Your Profile:** Once verified, log in and complete your profile with any additional required information.

Commonly Asked Questions

When can I start filling out the FAFSA?

You can begin filling out the FAFSA for 2025-2026 academic year December 1, 2024.

Who should complete the FAFSA form?

Any student, regardless of income, who wants to be considered for federal, state, and school financial aid programs. This includes grants, scholarships, work-study funds, and loans.

What do I need?

Verified account username and password (FSA ID), parent contributor name, date of birth, Social Security number, and **personal** email address.

How do I know if I qualify for financial aid?

The FAFSA will determine your eligibility for federal student aid based on the information you provide. You can log in to StudentAid.gov to check the status of your FAFSA form.

What happens after I submit my FAFSA?

After submission, you will receive a Student Aid Report (SAR) that summarized your information. Review it carefully for any errors.
