King Christian X on his horse

Frederik VII, king from 1848 to 1863, gave up the absolute monarchy and presented Denmark with its first constitution in 1849. He lived by the words, "The people's love is my strength."

Danish royal blood can be found throughout Europe. In fact, during the reign of Christian IX, one of his daughters was queen of England and another was tsarina of Russia. A grandson was elected king of Norway and another was king of Greece.

The royal family has been quite "common." King Christian X loved riding his horse through downtown Copenhagen. He would often dismount and chat with his subjects. Christian never rode with any guards and always stopped for traffic lights. When he was seriously ill shortly before his death, the people in the street would stop and talk to his son, Prince Frederik, while he was shopping. They honestly wanted to know how his father was feeling.
