Academic Program & Grading

The school year consists of two semesters. A day is composed of nine periods consisting of forty-one minutes each. The typical course load is six or seven courses. The semester grade is determined by averaging the two quarter grades and the exam grade with each quarter grade counting 2/5 and the exam counting 1/5. For **honors** classes, students earning a grade A+ through C- will receive an additional .5 on their semester average GPA, and for **Advanced Placement** (AP) classes/College Credit Plus (CCP) classes, an additional 1.0 on the semester average GPA.

Students may enroll in college level courses offered at Northview or at area colleges/universities to earn concurrent college and high school graduation credit. Between AP, College Credit Plus, and Career Technical coursework, 86% of the Class of 2024 took a course where they could earn college credit. 60% of the Class of 2024 graduated with college credit in hand.
