

Oblique Pictorials


An *Oblique pictorial* starts with a straight-on view of one of the object's faces, which is often the front face.


Angled, parallel lines are drawn to one side to represent the object's depth. Common oblique angles include 30°, 45°,




Types of Oblique Drawings

There are two types of *oblique pictorials*: *cavalier* and *cabinet*. The difference between the two is based on how the *depth* of the object is







Tonal Shading

Add tonal shading to two of the three view by drawing parallel lines spaced closely together.

Increase the contrast by cross-hatching the lines on the darkest face.
