It was so nice to meet all of our second grade families at open house. This month Firefighter Paul Ronco will be visiting each classroom to talk about fire safety. In reading we are completing an author study on Kevin Henkes. We are focusing on story elements, character traits and making connections. Our class will continue to practice addition and subtraction facts. Second graders are learning strategies for adding numbers quickly and efficiently. They have learned +10, +9 shortcut, doubles facts and doubles plus and minus 1! We will also be answering story problems by drawing, using number models and explaining our thinking. In writing we are focusing on sentence structure, and how writers use nouns, verbs, and adjectives to make our writing more exciting! We are writing 'Monster Tales'. These are fictional stories about monsters using many exciting nouns, verbs, and adjectives.

The first grade students are learning routines and settling in nicely. They have been learning many strategies in reading to help them work through tricky words with their reading, and are continuing to learn how to pick out "Just Right" books. Thank you for your support in completing the children's reading logs. In math, the students have been working on understanding word problems and turning them into number sentences. They have also been working on their accuracy for basic addition facts. We are also beginning to learn

about coins, what they look like and their value. Please continue to practice flashcards at home.

The students studied Christopher Columbus and learned more about his role in discovering America as a part of our social studies curriculum and they have been working on mapping skills by creating a map of their bedroom.

October Happenings in Grade 3

Cleveland's third graders have settled into the school routine nicely, and have been working really hard at school. October has been such a busy month with so many exciting activities such as: Open House/ice cream social, the book fair, a classroom visit from Firefighter Paul, a walk to the Norwood Library, picture day, and hand washing with Mrs. Abely.

In reading, third graders have been culminating the traditional literature unit, and have begun to have focus lessons on character traits, and have focused on how a book character changes from the beginning, middle, and of a story. In math, third graders have begun unit 1 which includes telling time to the nearest minute and will soon be starting to learn about elapsed time. It will be very helpful to assist your third grader in practicing reading an analog clock to the nearest five minute and 1 minute intervals. If your third grader doesn't know how to tell time on an analog clock, a wristwatch makes a perfect birthday or holiday gift. Once again, we would like to stress for all students to continue to practice the basic addition and subtraction facts at home.

In science, third graders have enjoyed lessons about gears, pulleys, Lego levers, and gyroplanes. Each class will soon be wrapping up the

forces unit by taking the first Science Center unit test, and will then be moving on to the next science unit which will about Earth and the Solar System. In social studies, each class has begun to learn about the early history of Massachusetts, which will include lessons about the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag. For this unit, third graders will be using the grade 3 Massachusetts textbook as well as supplementary trade books as they learn about the early days of Massachusetts and the early residents of our state.

In third grade writing occurs throughout each school day during activities such as Quick Writes, reading responses, graphic organizers, retellings, compare/contrasts, etc. In addition, third graders are currently working on writing a personal narrative, and are going through several steps that will teach them how to develop a well written personal narrative essay.

At this time, the third grade teachers would like to thank you for all of your help with homework, and for returning information back to school in a timely manner. We would also like to thank Mrs. Jean Todesca and her staff at the Norwood Library for planning the field trips for the Cleveland third graders. Not only did the students learn a wealth of information about the Norwood Library, each student had an opportunity to apply for a library card. As the temperatures become colder, please remember to send your third grader dressed warmly so that he/she may go outside for recess. Lastly, we are looking forward to see you for the upcoming parent conferences on November 6th and 7th.

Great Things Are Happening in Fourth Grade....

It's hard to believe that October has come to an end. We have been very busy in Fourth Grade. In Science we wrapped up our Earth and Solar System Unit by having the children complete a mini-research cereal box project on one of the planets. We then embarked on a Planet Walk so that the children could understand the distance each planet is from the sun. We were lucky this year that we had fantastic weather for our journey. Along the way the children shared information that they had learned about each planet. This was a great way to exercise for the October Fitness Challenge. It was an "out of this world experience!"

We celebrated "Observation Month" to enhance our writing program. Each week the fourth grade teachers dressed up in wacky outfits. The children needed to "observe" what was wrong with us and they needed to tell us "how to fix our appearance" so that we would be more appropriately dressed for school. This included using graphic organizers, friendly letters, illustrations, and of course, a sense of humor. The children impressed us with their ability to write with details and write creatively, while at the same time, using correct writing formats and grammar. There was much laughter in the Fourth Grade Wing this month.

In Math, we have been working on gaining familiarity with factors and multiples. The children have learned some new ways to determine if a number can be divisible by another number by following some divisibility rules. Ask your child to show you how this works. Please continue to encourage your child to memorize their facts. By the end of



the year, they should know all tables through the 12's. All the fourth grade has been working on Addition and Subtraction Problem Solving using models and alternate algorithms. Students are learning different ways to solve problems, visualize problems, demonstrate equations in models, and explain their thinking.

Technology is being used in all of our classrooms. The children are learning how to use the IPADS and Chromebooks. We are learning how to use Google Drive to create, edit, and share documents. We are very fortunate to have such wonderful technology!

This year we enjoyed celebrating both Halloween and our first Purple People Eater Day. It is a celebration that allows all children to participate regardless of their beliefs. We created our

own comic books using the famous song, "Purple People Eater", by Sheb Wooley. The children wrote the lyrics to this song using correct punctuation, capitalization, and quotations. As a grade we were challenged by Mrs. Coppola to perform a song/dance for the whole school. We gladly accepted the challenge and had a great time! We were a sea of purple and pajamas!
