After one month into the school year, we are experiencing more than normal bus behavioral issues. School bus behaviors go beyond disrespect. They also create a safety hazard for EVERYONE on board. To ensure safe, efficient transportation service, students should:


- Arrive at bus stops before the buses are scheduled to arrive.
- Wait in locations clear of traffic and away from where the bus stops.
- Behave at the school bus stop.
- Go directly to a seat (empty or assigned) so the bus may safely resume motion.
- Remain seated, keeping aisles and exits clear.
- Observe classroom conduct and obey drivers promptly and respectfully.
- Do not use profane language.
- Do not eat or drink on buses, except as required for medical reasons.
- Do not use tobacco on buses.
- Do not possess alcohol or drugs on buses, except for required prescription medication.
- Do not throw or pass objects on, from, or into buses.
- Students must leave or board buses at assigned locations, unless they have parental and administrative authorization to do otherwise.

The school and bus climate should be one of mutual respect. We all deserve to feel respected. Teachers "teach to" the expected student behaviors. The students are taught what is expected of them. "And when children learn how to meet high expectations for behavior, when they come to believe in their own ability to change their behavioral patterns --- that is when they can feel honest pride in their own accomplishments. 

Academic News

MAP & ISIP Literacy Testing (Round 1) Complete

Students in sixth through tenth grades complete MAP, or the Measure of Academic Progress, which is a computerized adaptive test which helps teachers, parents, and administrators improve learning for all students and make informed decisions to promote a child's academic growth. MAP is used to measure a student's progress or growth in school. The testing information is important to teachers because it indicates what student's strengths are and help that is needed in any specific areas. Teachers can use this information to help them guide instruction in the classroom. If you have ever used a growth chart in your home to show how much your child has grown from one year to the next, it will help you understand the scale MAP uses to measure your child's academic progress. The measurement system is called the RIT Scale (Rasch unIT), and is an equal-interval scale much like feet and inches on a yardstick. The scale is used to chart your child's academic growth from year to year. RIT scores typically start at the 140 to 190 level in third grade and progress to the 240 to 300 level by high school.

Hello Sun River Valley!

Principal's Message

It's been a great start to the school year here at FSE! Students have spent time learning classroom and school procedures, rules, and expectations. Teachers and students are building meaningful relationships. Our school community is wonderful!

Our school population has grown this year. We have new families joining our Tiger Cubs. Last year our student population ended at 107 PK-5. As of the time of this letter, we are currently sitting at 120. It's great that our school has an excellent reputation, and people around the area are aware of that and choose to send their students to FSE!

The new math series, Bridges, is being implemented. Teachers and students are noticing a big difference with instruction. It's a different way of thinking about math and our students have not been exposed to explaining their thinking and how to understand mathematical concepts. This curriculum is a lot different than our last one and will take time for students and teachers to feel comfortable. It has been researched that when schools implement new curriculum it can take up to 3 years to really benefit and have solid results. This is due to all the different materials, instruction, structure, application of learning, and students and teachers becoming proficient with the series. I feel we will start seeing improved math scores and abilities sooner then that due to our wonderful staff and how hard they are working with our new series.

Students from the FFA program at the High School came down and read in our classrooms on September 5th. They completed activities, read stories, and delivered free books to our teachers. The FFA students even had time to go and play at recess with some of our classes! Thank you Mrs. Koterba for bringing your students down to share with us and donate books!

We have a change in the way we will conduct our assemblies this year. There will no longer be Trimester Award Assemblies. There will be a monthly assembly where a few students from each grade will be recognized, social skills winners will be announced, and students of the month will receive their award. We will also have our Minute-to-Win-It games at this time. Our staff feels the Trimester Assemblies lasted far too long for our students, and it interfered with instructional time. Also, we feel that the assembly is for students to be recognized in front of the staff and their peers. We will not be inviting families to attend each month. However, we will have a large assembly at the end of the year to recognize students, and families will be invited to attend. Please understand that this will be a better situation for our students and staff.

Some other things students have been practicing are safety drills, such as fire and lockdown drills. These will be conducted throughout the year so students know how to react in different types of emergencies. To aid in our school safety practices, more cameras have been added to our building as well. We want to keep our students and staff as safe as possible.

Another exciting project underway is the Playground Pavilion! As of today it is nearing completion. This is a great structure to add to our playground! It provides a picnic area, shelter from the elements, and is a wonderful addition to the community. RKL Construction built the structure for us. Thank you so much! It looks awesome!

2019 Simms Tigers Football Season has gotten off to a great start. The first week of the season, we traveled to Big Sky, MT, to play Lone Peak High School. We came away victorious with a 46-20 win. Tigers were led offensively by Mikey Leach, Stephen Links, and Caden Smerker. Our defense was led by Orion MacDonald, Lane Hinderager, and Hunter Decker.

The second week of the season took us to Shelby, MT, to battle the Coyotes. In the end, we lost a tough, competitive game to one of the top teams in the State 39-18. We had great, all-around performances from Mikey Leach, who again topped 200 yards rushing on the game, Caden Smerker led the team with tackles, and Stephen Links ran for a rushing touchdown. Timer Thomas scored on a punt return.

Our Homecoming game brought big crowds and a huge victory for the Simms Tigers, beating the Chinook Sugarbeaters 30-8. Simms hadn't seen this victory since 2013. Our defense had a strong showing, keeping the Sugarbeaters to only 8 points. Hunter Decker, Vincent Offerdahl, and Josey Hinderager led the swarming Tiger defense. On the offensive side of the ball, Stephen Links was 9-9, 179 yards, 1 touchdown passing, rushed for 10 carries and 112 yards and 2 touchdowns. Mikey Leach again had a strong performance rushing the ball with 12 carries for 136 yards and a touchdown. Caden Smerker led the team in receiving with 3 catches and 74 yards. It was a huge win for the Tigers. We're on the right path for the 2019 season.
