Mr. Hornberger inquired about information related to stipends for clubs. The Superintendent of Schools stated that a mid-year report is established by Principals. Ms. Napolitano addressed Ms. Patterson's letter of resignation for the purpose of retirement in stating how sad she was to hear about Ms. Patterson's intention to retire.
