Sixth Grade News (Class of 2023)

LANGUAGE ARTS

NEWS:

The students have been hard at work with our first unit on Literary Devices in Literature. We've been discussing the layout of a story using the Plot Diagram and developing and analyzing characters in our texts by giving them character traits as well as demonstrating how characters can change and develop based on the events in the story. We'll continue the literary journey by examining the theme of texts, summarizing, and looking at foreshadowing and how those elements enhance a book. This will lead us into our first beacon common assessment at the end of October. Encourage your child to read at least 15 minutes a night—whether it's to a sibling or parent, or reading a magazine or newspaper. Every little bit helps in the long run.

MATH NEWS:

In mathematics, our Jaguars have started learning the foundations of middle grade number systems. The Common Core Standards of N.S I through N.S. 4 was covered in the month of September which includes long division, operations with decimals, greatest common factors and least common multiples, and multiplying and dividing fractions by fractions. We will complete this unit by the end of October in preparation for our first beacon common assessment.

SCIENCE NEWS:

Sixth grade science students just finished their Scientific Inquiry/Method unit. Students were very engaged during the skittles science experiment. Students will review this information throughout the year as it will come up in every scientific experiment or investigation. The new unit on

matter involves studying the structure, function, and classification of matter. This unit encompasses three sub units and will take us to the end of the quarter in October. Be sure to ask your students about all the exciting things they are leaning in 6th grade science!

SOCIAL STUDIES NEWS:

We spent the first few weeks of school explaining rules and procedures. There are also several assignments designed to help us get to know your children. As we dig deeper into the curriculum, the work will become more challenging. It is important that students understand their responsibility in their learning. We just finished our first unit of study on Map Skills. Students took their first test this week on that unit. We will begin our unit on the Five Themes of Geography next week.

UPCOMING EVENTS & REMINDERS:

The sixth grade team has been hard at work since day one welcoming the new Jags to Eastway. We have been diligently working on making sure all 6th grade Jaguars are working on following the rules and procedures set by their teachers and meeting the expectations that are set by Eastway Middle and the 6th grade team. On October 19, sixth graders have a field trip to the Renaissance Festival. Permission slips went home with your child On September 27-29. The cost to attend the trip is \$16.00. If students want to purchase items at the festival, they will need to bring extra money to make those purchases. Permission forms and money are due on October 14.

Seventh Grade News (Class of 2022)

LANGUAGE ARTS NEWS:

Students are currently extracting inferences and themes using textual evidence. Texts used during this unit include: "Thank you Ma'am" by Langston Hughes, and "Names/Nombres" by Julia Alvarez. Additionally, students are becoming familiar with root words, prefixes, and suffixes through their "Word Within A Word" learning station.

MATH NEWS:

Students are currently studying the *Number System*, and *Expressions & Equations*. An important focus of instruction is students' ability to solve multi-step reallife and mathematical problems where teachers are supporting

students' understanding of how math connects to the real world.

SCIENCE NEWS:

Students are currently working towards becoming knowledgeable of the composition and structure of the earth's atmosphere, which consists of the earth's layers, air pressure, weather, water cycle, and air fronts. Students will be able to identify and thoroughly understand these properties and their role in the earth's atmosphere.

SOCIAL STUDIES NEWS:

Students are currently gaining additional knowledge on the foundations of Social Studies, needed for application to materials learned throughout this

academic year. The Foundations Unit consists of subunits covering Continents & Oceans, 5 Themes of Geography, Primary & Secondary Sources, Economic Systems, and Political Systems. Next week, students will begin the Renaissance Unit, where they will be working towards understanding and analyzing the motivations of the Renaissance, describing events that led up to the era, and identifying how contributions have benefitted today's society. In observance of Political Season, Social Studies teachers are implementing a student mock election, demonstrating the purpose of elections & procedures followed when elections are held.

UPCOMING EVENTS & REMINDERS:

Students have been receptive to the adoption of the Jaguar Bucks Initiative, where they are given an opportunity to collect "Jag Bucks" for displaying exemplary behavior throughout the day. These bucks can be disbursed either each Friday where students are given an opportunity to have free time outside for 3 "lag Bucks", or at the end of the academic quarter where students are given another opportunity to spend 15 "Jag Bucks" for admission to a school social.

Eighth Grade News (Class of 2021)

LANGUAGE ARTS NEWS:

Students have just completed MAP testing. Ask them about their lexile range, and they should be able to tell you. They should use this information to read a text at their level every night. Students can check out books from their core classroom libraries. Additionally, students should be studying their Words within a Word stems daily. They can practice online through Quizlet. Over the past month, students have been examining elements of fiction and how things like suspense, humor and point of view impact the story. In the following month, we will be studying the structure of texts as well as using

evidence to support an argument or claim.

MATH NEWS:

Math has gotten off to a great start with insights into how fractions and decimals relate to each other. Next, we'll be looking into exponential notation with activities to <u>raise</u> our awareness of the <u>power</u> of exponents. These studies will later lead to using scientific notation and seeing how practical exponents are in the real world.

SCIENCE NEWS:

In science, our students are exploring the periodic table, and using that knowledge to balance chemical equations.

Next we are going to dive deep into the water unit.

SOCIAL STUDIES NEWS:

Social studies has been focused on understanding Native American history and culture, the Age of Exploration, and studying the origins of the 13 Colonies in the America's. We have studied everything from the Salem Witch Trials-where New England colonist feared witches were taking over their colony!--to the massive importing of African slaves into the Southern Colonies to harvest cash crops on plantations. This week, we begin our study for the causes for the American Revolution, and how our country became

independent from England!
