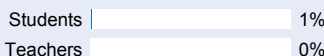

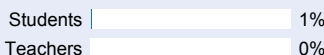

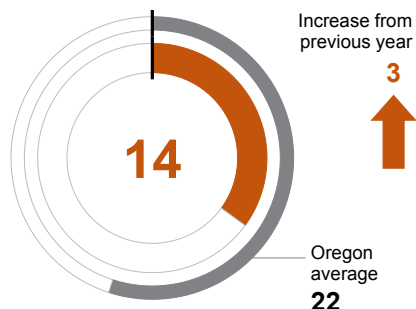

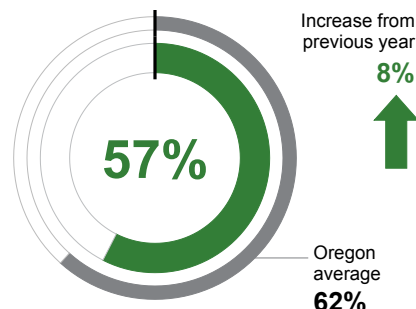
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

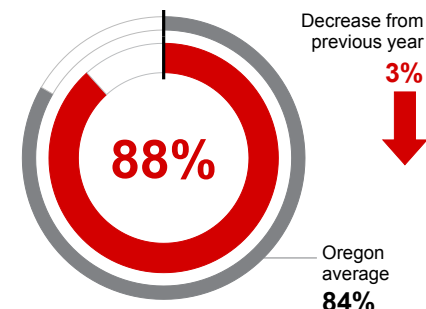
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

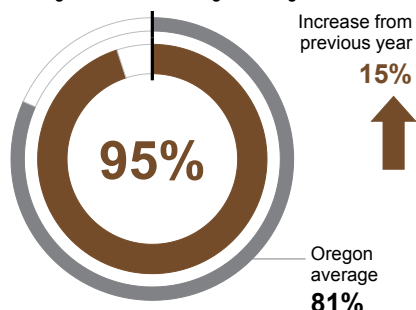
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

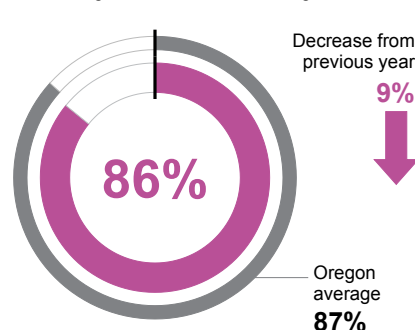
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2018-19 graduating in 2021-22.



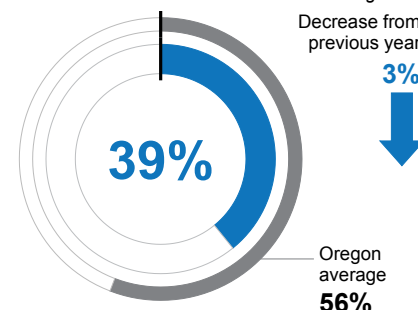
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

NHS has a Tillamook Bay Community College satellite campus on our premises, where our students are able to WR121, WR122 and ENG104. In addition, Nestucca partners with Tillamook Bay Community College to offer students dual college/high school credits. Students are also able to take many online college courses during school hours and earn dual credit.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Our students have the opportunity to enroll in CTE courses and earn their endorsement in the Agricultural Sciences and, beginning this year, a Pre-Apprenticeship Construction programs. We are also developing a program Art. Along with these certified CTE courses, all students take career exploration courses each year to prepare them for life after high school.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

NHS hosts several nights a year for parents, including Open House, Parent Teacher Conferences, Hazelden Betty Ford Night, FAFSA Night, etc. We are also an immediate occupancy Emergency Evacuation site. Last spring we started a CTE Exploratory class where businesses in the community came in once a week for an hour and gave a hands on presentation about their career. Students signed up for the career they wanted to visit each week. Our community members were actually calling us asking if they could come present. In addition, we have a very strong parent group (NVASI) that does big fundraisers and volunteers endless hours, and thanks to them, we have been able to purchase new uniforms and equipment. NHS is grateful for its community.
