Objectives covered in the coming weeks:




Math: During the next few weeks, our math class will be learning how to use and represent whole numbers through the hundred thousands place. We will also be adding and subtracting multi-digit numbers. You can expect to see homework that provides practice with naming numbers in different ways, as well as rounding and estimating greater numbers.

Science: In science, we will begin our unit on life science, which will encompass a study of human body systems, including their functions, interactions, and reliance up-

on other systems within the body. Students will also learn to use skills necessary to conduct scientific inquiry by conducting hands-on scientific experiments during class.


ELA: This week in ELA we will be discussing the question-"Where do clever ideas come from?" We will be doing this while discussing literature elements of character, setting, and plot. We will be working on sequencing events in stories we read as well as retelling stories in our own words. We will also be discussing how to make predictions and de-

geographical regions and features of Mississippi. We will discuss the state's natural resources, particularly the Mississippi river. We will learn how to read maps and we will discuss the contributions of Native Americans on our state as well as their continued im-

PBIS Calendar: Students will receive their PBIS calendars this week. Students receive 3 points a day: 1 for attendance, 1 for being on time (by 7:45 a.m. in the classroom), 1 for showing good behavior. Students who fail to do any of these will lose the corresponding point. If there is no mark, your student had a great day and received all 3 points! Students with 15 points at the end of each week (3 points per day for 5 days in a row) will receive a reward from their homeroom teacher. Parents, please initial each day's square in order to indicate to teachers that you have seen whether or not your students received all their points. Both teachers and parents can use the back side to communicate any other notes. Please note that the calendar can be marked by any of

the staff at Power APAC because it reflects any inappropriate action taken by students at school. <u>If</u> <u>students misplace the PBIS calendar, they will not</u> <u>receive any points for the rest of the month.</u>




