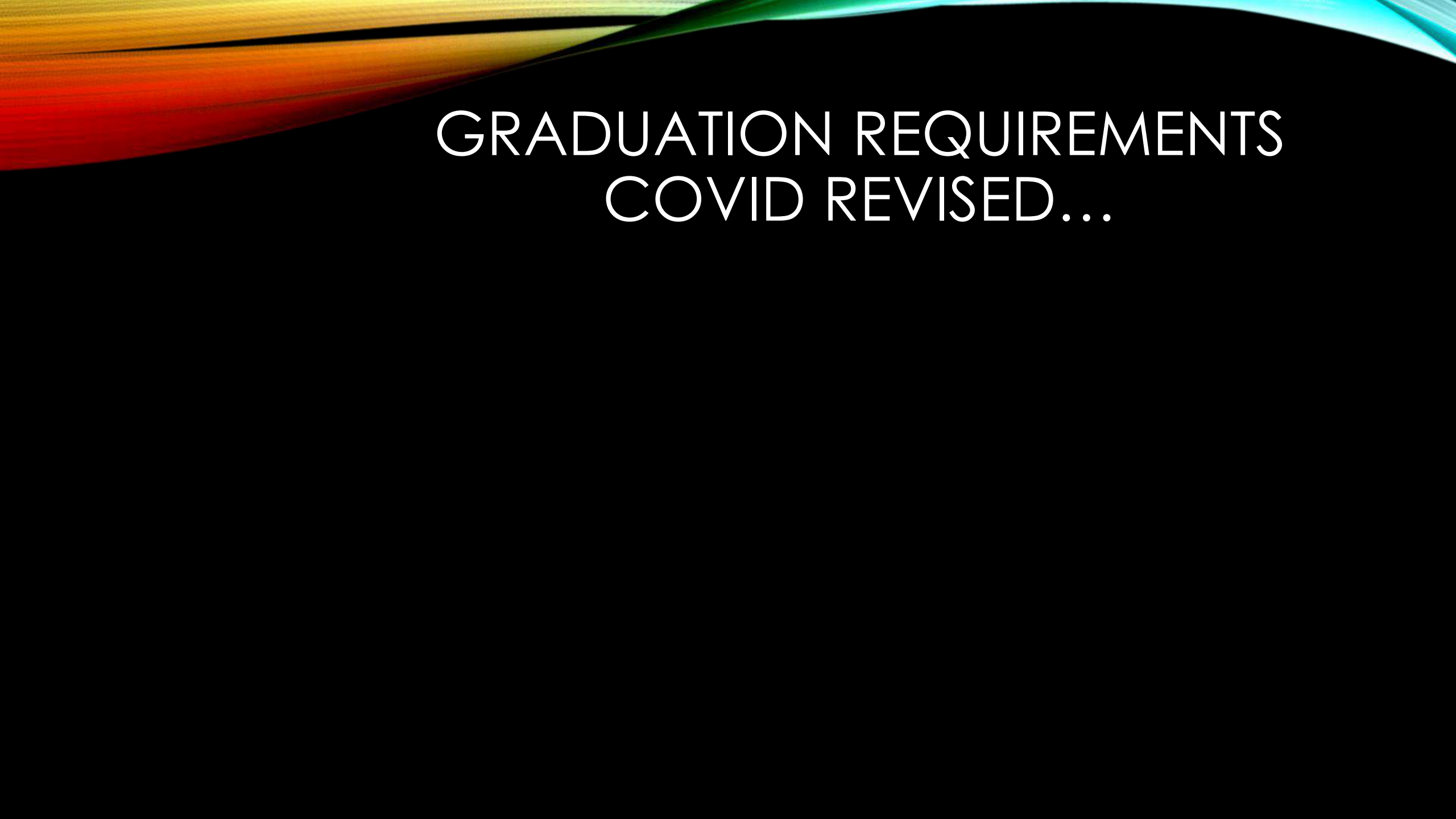

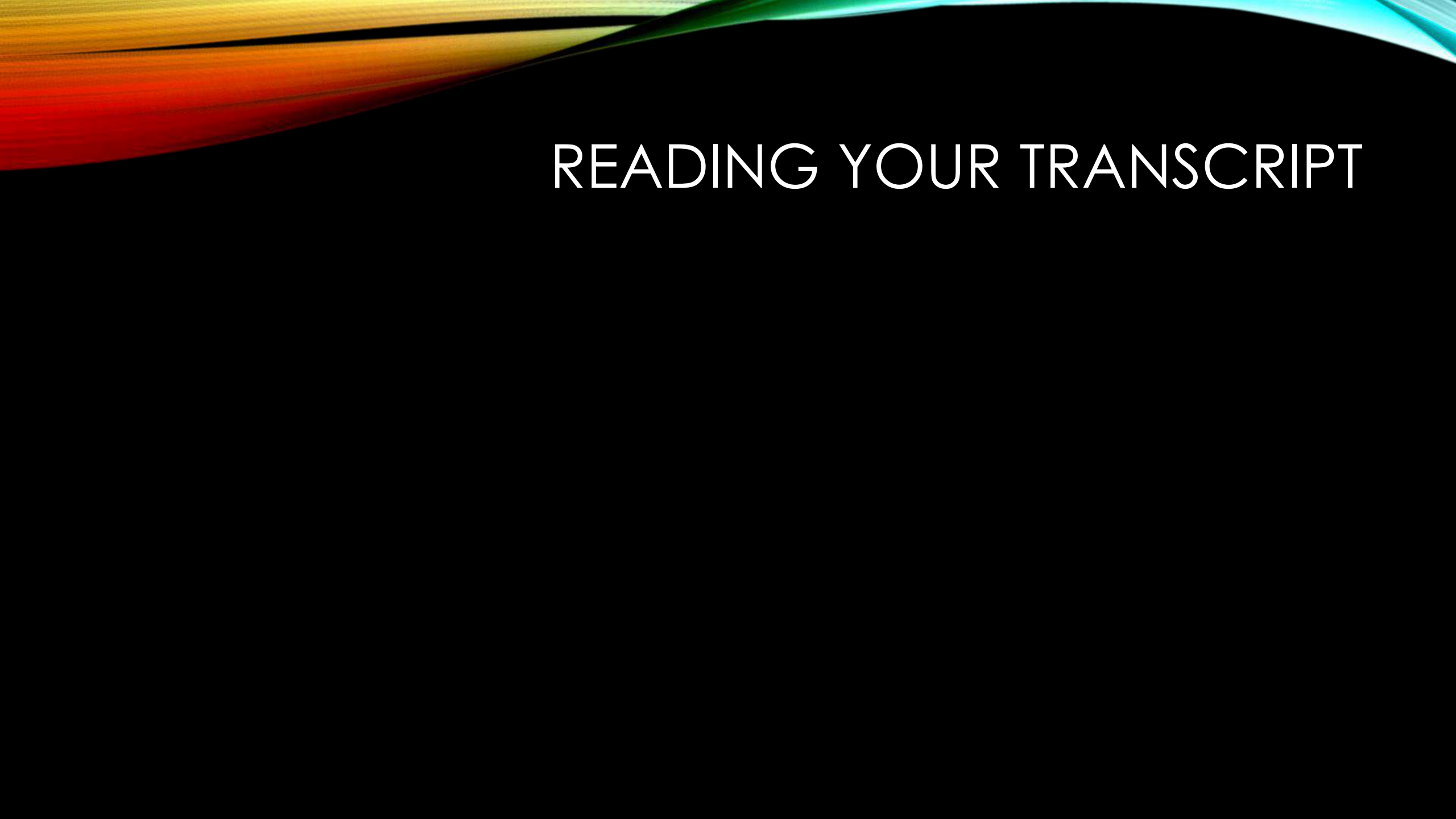

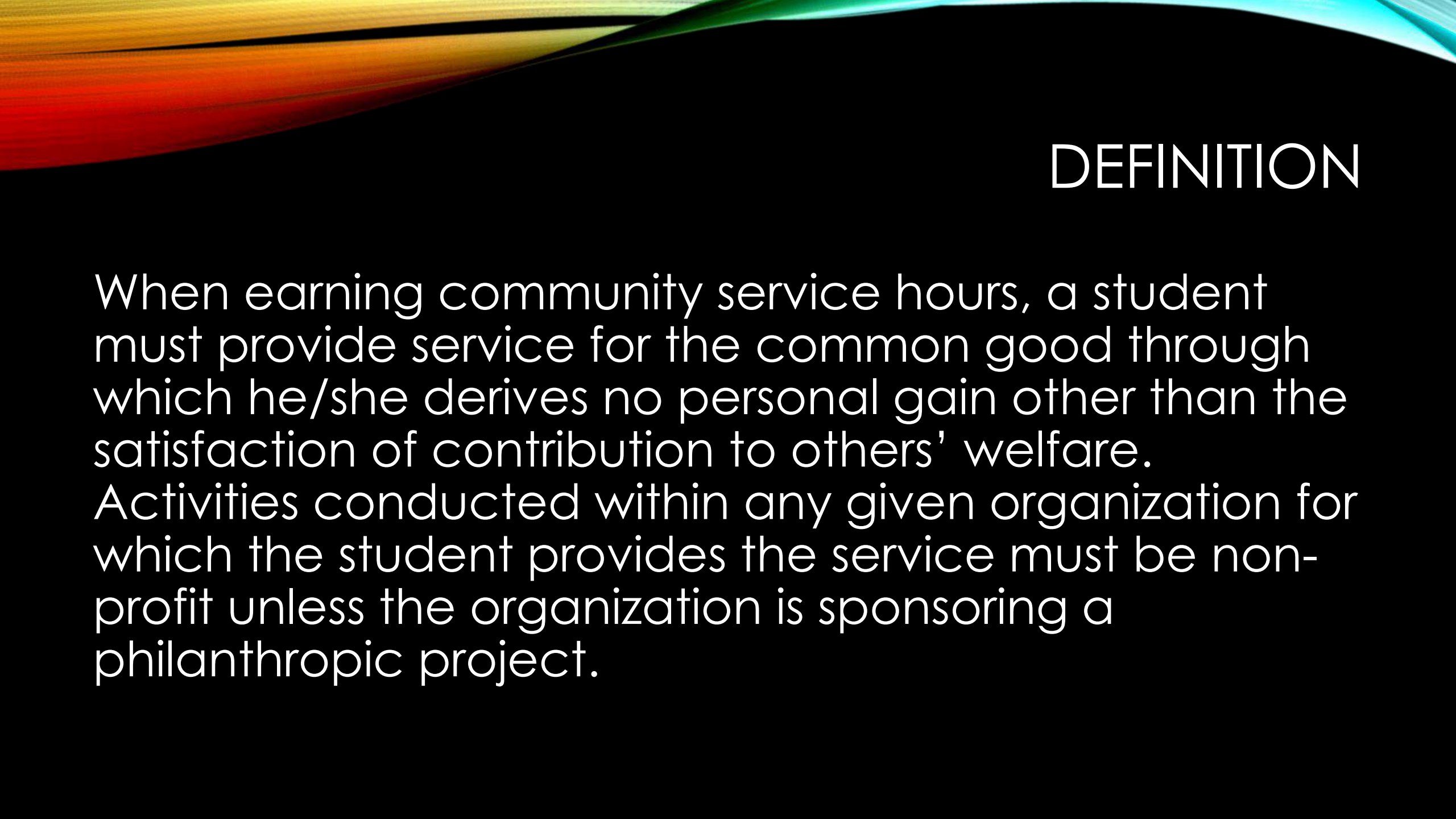

DEFINITION

When earning community service hours, a student must provide service for the common good through which he/she derives no personal gain other than the satisfaction of contribution to others' welfare. Activities conducted within any given organization for which the student provides the service must be non-profit unless the organization is sponsoring a philanthropic project.



COMMUNITY SERVICE

What It Is and What It Is Not...



What It Is

- Helper at a community library
- Involvement with any recognized philanthropic organization
- Helping on church-sponsored community outreach events or childcare

What It Is Not

- Babysitter for hire
- Tasks done at home
- Preparing for or participating in a religious service

What It Is

- Get-out-the-vote campaigns
- Distribution of material
- Attending public meetings
- Volunteering as a camp counselor
- Helping with community events i.e. Parks & Rec programs, clean ups
- Mowing a lawn to help a disabled or elderly person
- Senior citizen help with groceries, etc.

What It Is Not

- Campaigning or distributing material for a candidate
- Community service performed as discipline for behavior
- Working for a profit-making business
- Working as a **paid** camp counselor
- Inviting a neighbor to dinner your parents' prepared
- Mowing your grandparents' lawn

COLLEGE APPLICATIONS

- Go to college fairs (October 7) and tours
- Apply by January if you want to apply for the college's scholarships
- Some universities have application deadlines, starting as early as October and November
- Check out the Seniors Googleclassroom page code: kr5kedg for links
- Keep your grades up. Colleges require an official transcript after semester or at the end of the year.
- Plan to take the SAT on October 13, it helps with college admissions, placement in writing and math, and scholarships.
- Community colleges have rolling admissions

SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS

- If you receive scholarships from a university, be sure to let us know...
Applying early to college enters you into a lot of them.
- Check Senior Googleclassroom
- Due dates are the scholarship deadlines
- Keep your grades up. Many scholarships ask for your transcript

 - Interviews
 - Essays (keep all essays)

CHAFEE EDUCATION AND TRAINING GRANT

- Purpose
- The Department of Human Services (DHS) Independent Living Program (ILP) has received Chafee Education and Training Voucher (ETV) funding to help current or former foster care youth with postsecondary education and training.
- Eligibility Requirements
- To be eligible, you must:
- Currently be in child welfare foster care, **or**
- Had been in child welfare foster care for at least 180 days (six months) after your 14th birthday and **exited substitute care at age 16 or older, or**
- **NEW:** Be a former foster youth who was adopted or entered into a guardianship on or after your 13th birthday, and your adoption/guardianship finalized after **9/1/2015**.
- **NEW:** Final disbursement will not exceed the term before the youth turns age **26**.
- **NEW:** Students can receive the ETG for a maximum number of 5 years.
- Students no longer need to be accessing Chafee funds before age 21.
