

About This Group



Online Art Teachers (K-12)
Facebook Group was formed on March
11, 2020 as a service project BY art
teachers FOR art teachers during
COVID19 social distancing. With 7000+
members and over 62K posts, this
world-wide collaboration of art educators
is providing a much needed resource for
teachers.

On the morning of March 11th, Dr. Harlow woke up with a calling to do something to help art teachers in Washington and northern California, and a few other geographic locations, who were reaching out on social media for help and to express their shock at how fast the switch to home-centered learning was happening for them. The Facebook Group and a Google Classroom, which has now become a Google Folder, were started in an effort

to assist teachers who were reaching out for help. Dr. Harlow was able to pull from her experiences teaching in some developing countries to jump into action and to begin mentoring teachers to give choices that were no tech, low tech, and hi tech – differentiating instruction as teachers typically do in brick and mortar classrooms. The group quickly grew and had over 1000 members by the second morning, and at the time of this newsletter, which is 28 days into the group's existence, the group has 7,520 members and over 62,000 posts made by art teachers who are sharing resources and offering suggestions. Dr. Harlow knew there was a need for this group, yet could have never imagined the outpouring of art teachers from all 50 states and more than 25 countries reaching out to help mentor each other and provide and share resources that they selflessly made with group members. On day two, six national and state leaders in art education also joined the effort as administrators and are Sarah Cress-Ackermann (Illinois), Beth Dobberstein (Wisconsin), Kate Miller (Kansas), Bob Reeker (Nebraska), Randy Robart (Ohio), and Marie Taylor (Kansas). The group is also collaborating with the NAEA Public Policy & Arts Administration Special Interest Group as another role of the group is advocating for continued and seamless art instruction in schools and districts.

Online Art Teachers (K-12) is a service project for art teachers by art

teachers. No one is profiting from this group. Our initial purpose has been a platform to share resources with each other. Our next step, as we imagine it, will be to support each other as the journey becomes more difficult. And, finally, we look forward, with hope, to the day in which group members can share their experience and that of their students also on the Facebook Page. An art show called the Covy's sounds like a good way to document this experience.

Using the Facebook Page




To use the Facebook page the most effectively:

- Become familiar with the TOPICS Tabs.
- Read ABOUT. Links you may need are there.
- Check the ANNOUNCEMENT section, as we pin important information there.
- Become familiar with the FILES
 tab where you can upload pdf
 documents of assignments,
 choice boards, etc. that you make
 to share with others. (Please also

- upload them in the Google Folder.)
- Encourage teachers on Facebook posts.
- Click on the ADVICE NEEDED topic tab and give advice to teachers whose posts have been filed there.
- Share your good ideas.



Copyright Information




In the first video made for this Facebook Group, Dr. Harlow addressed copyright. This video was shared all over social media and this is what initially brought teachers to this group and to know this group existed. In that initial video, Dr. Harlow asked three things:

- To know if you share something here that it is your choice to do so and others will be using it. If you want to publish something you have written, it is up to you if you share it here.
- 2. To not share resources that are copyrighted.
- And to not publish something you see in this group or Google folder as if you had written it. She mentioned the honor system during this difficult time.
