Op art is the short name of Optical art wherein the artist uses optical illusions to make their artwork.



- Op Art is a simple version of abstract art.
- Generally, these artists use black and white paper to bring visual illusion.
- Technically, these are hidden images of vibrating and flashing straight patterns.
- These black and white paintings with vibrant and flashing patterns are the cause of attraction and massive demand for it.
- These patterns create contradiction and illusion through their arrangement.

You will notice slow movement when you look at an Opt Art work of art.


This slow movement is called hallucination.

Op art is the extension of these art styles- Constructivism and Dada, Neo-impressionism and to some extent- Futurism and Cubism.
