Important Update — 2024-2025 School Year

The Bottom Line...

... **Preschoolers** will now attend Buckeye or Melridge elementary schools.

...

... **Fifth graders** who would typically attend Buckeye and Melridge will now attend LaMuth Middle School.

...

Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, all fifth grade students who would typically attend Buckeye and Melridge elementary schools will attend LaMuth Middle School. These fifth grade students will follow the LaMuth Middle School bell schedule (8 a.m. to 3:05 p.m.) but still be taught a typical fifth grade elementary curriculum by fifth grade teachers. They will also still participate in specials as well as have time for recess.

Fifth graders attending Parkside and Riverview elementary schools will remain at their respective schools. Nothing will change for these students.

What led to this decision? For the last several years, the District has been leasing Hale Road from the Educational Service Center of the Western Reserve to host its Preschool program. It has been a priority for the District to move Preschool back into one of our elementary buildings, as operating the program at Hale Road has presented many challenges. LaMuth Middle School currently has classrooms that are available for use.

Beginning with the 2024-2025 school

year, these classrooms will be used for fifth grade students and staff from Buckeye and Melridge elementary schools. Freeing up classrooms at Buckeye and Melridge elementary schools will now allow space for us to operate our Preschool program in-house.

These moves are being made until a larger District-wide Facilities Master Plan is created and implemented. The District has been struggling with facility and enrollment issues for many years. In 2016, the District developed a three-phase Facility Plan that called for the construction of new buildings while decommissioning our old, aging and outdated facilities. While Phase 1 of that Facilities Plan was implemented thanks to the passage of a Bond Levy, Phase 2 was not successful and the Board of Education and District administration are currently working to create a revised plan to help solve facility and enrollment issues. This plan will involve professional and community involvement. Please stay tuned for more information.

Partnership With Sheriff's Office Gains National Safety Grant

The Riverside Local School District was recently awarded a \$212,755 grant from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office) through its School Violence Prevention Program. Riverside partnered with the Lake County Sheriff's Office to write and submit a comprehensive grant application. Riverside is one of only two public school districts in the State of Ohio to receive this award. Nationally, only 206 out of 1,022 grant applications were funded, which

represents approximately 20 percent of the total number of applications submitted.

The COPS Office School Violence Prevention Program is a competitive award program designed to provide funding to improve security at schools and on school grounds in the grantee's jurisdiction through evidence-based school safety programs.

Riverside will use these grant funds for the purchase, installation, setup, and training of a District-wide communication system consisting of 400 individual

hands-free badges that allow for instant communication. These hands-free badges will be assigned to teachers and various staff throughout the District. This system can be used for both emergencies and for day-to-day operations and communication. The grant will cover approximately 75% of the cost of this system. Implementation of this system further demonstrates the District's commitment to providing a safe and supportive environment for its students, teachers, and staff.

Riverside appreciates its strong partnership with the Lake County Sheriff's Office. Without their assistance, this project would not have been possible.





Security Vestibules For Legacy Buildings

The Riverside Local School District Board of Education approved a contract with Lakeland Management Systems to construct improved, secure vestibule entrances at Buckeye Elementary, Melridge Elementary, LaMuth Middle School and Riverside Campus. Each building will include two layers of entrance doors with a transaction window in between.

These updated entrances will allow for visitors to be properly vetted between two sets of locked doors before entering the building. The transaction window will allow for visitors to drop off deliveries without ever having to enter the building.

Parkside and Riverview elementary schools already feature these vestibule entrances.



The new entrances will feature a handicap button that will open the doors when they are unlocked in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. The vestibules will also feature a new buzzer and intercom system, level 3 ballistic glass and new cameras.

The project is tentatively expected to be completed by the start of the 2024-2025 school year.

Fully Staffed for SAFETY

For the first time ever, each school in the District has a full-time School Safety Officer (SSO) on duty during school hours. This is in addition to our two District-wide School Resource Officers (SRO). Thank you for keeping our students and staff safe!
