
















### **Set your Camera to Manual**

Set your camera mode dial to **Manual Mode.** 

In this mode, the dial at the top of your camera allows you to control all aspects of your camera.





### SLOWER SHUTTER SPEED MORE LIGHT ENTERS CAMERA / MORE DEPTH OF FIELD

### **Shutter Speed**

You will need to set your shutter speed to a minimum of 10 seconds long and your camera must be on a tripod.

**FASTER SHUTTER SPEED** 

LESS LIGHT ENTERS CAMERA / DECREASED DEPTH OF FIELD



### **Set your White Balance to Auto**

- Click on the WB button on the back of your camera
- Adjust the settings to Auto





### Set your ISO to 100.

- Click on the ISO button on the back of your camera
- Adjust the settings to 100 to allow for the longer shutter speed in a dark space





### Set your aperture to f/8 or higher

- Click and hold the AV button on the back of your camera
- Using the dial at the top of the camera, scroll to f/8 or higher.
- If you are needing a longer shutter speed, move your aperture to a bigger number. Bigger numbers = smaller opening = less light coming in.





### Make sure your camera is set to Large JPEG

- Click on the Menu button on the back of your camera
- Find the Image Quality menu in the camera menu
- Make sure RAW is set to --
- And JPEG is set to the first L









### **Setting your focus point**

- Click and HOLD the AF Point Selection Button while looking through the viewfinder
- Use the main dial to change the location of the red dot on the focus grid
- Release the AF Point Selection Button
- Looking through the viewfinder, press halfway down on the shutter button to verify the location of your focus point.
- Once you've set your focus point, switch your lens to manual focus







**Tripods are REQUIRED for this project!** 


### Using different light sources, create a unique scene in the dark with a long exposure.


- Create your scene using small objects or other people
- Set your camera up on a tripod and focus it on your subject while in a fully lit room or by using a flashlight to light up your subject while you focus.
- Turn off the lights!
- Use multiple different light sources to light your scene.
  - Remember: Narrow light comes from a light source pointed at the camera while broad light comes from a light source being pointed at the subject.
  - Use different colored gels in front of your lights to create color in your image
  - Use light sources such as cell phone flashlights, the front of your cell phone, flashlights, laser pointers, computer screens, projectors, string lights, fake candles, night lights, and more!
  - Do not use sparklers, fire, fireworks, or lighters.

### **REMEMBER YOUR COMPOSITION!**









Keep the rule of thirds in mind when photographing your subject!

Take notes, as you shoot your assignment, of the settings. You will be reading these settings later to better understand proper exposure.
