Lesson Plan: Intro to papermaking

Estimated amount of time required for this lesson: 1 class period

Learning Objective(s): Students will learn how to make recycled paper

Materials and Resources: Towels, shredded or ripped paper scrap, blender, large empty plastic bin, deckles x5, drying rack, pencils (or markers)

Vocabulary: Deckle, slurry, pulp.

Procedures/Content: Students will be given a short demonstration on paper making and attempt to pull their first pieces of recycled paper as a class.

Assessment: Exploration with new materials. Trial and error. Class discussion.

Lesson Plan: Papermaking

Estimated amount of time required for this lesson: 1-2 class periods

Learning Objective(s): Students will pull recycled sheets of paper

Materials and Resources: Towels, shredded or ripped paper scrap, blender, large empty plastic bin, deckles x5, drying rack, pencils (or markers)

Vocabulary: Deckle, slurry, pulp.

Procedures/Content: Students will be given the class time to pull sheets of paper as a class.

Assessment: Exploration with new materials. Trial and error. Class discussion. Sketch for work of art to be made with recycled paper.

Lesson Plan: Paper usage

Estimated amount of time required for this lesson: 1-2 class periods

Learning Objective(s): Students will learn how to use the paper they have made to create works of art.

Materials and Resources: Towels, shredded or ripped paper scrap, blender, large empty plastic bin, deckles x5, drying rack, pencils (or markers)

Vocabulary: Deckle, slurry, pulp.

Procedures/Content: Students will be given the class time to create a work of art with the paper they have created. The subject matter and form of art is completely up to the student. Materials that work well on the paper will be made available at each table. Students will be encouraged to use sketchbooks and scrap paper to sketch out ideas prior to beginning the final piece.

Assessment: Exploration with new materials. Trial and error. Class discussion.
