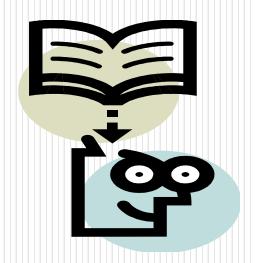

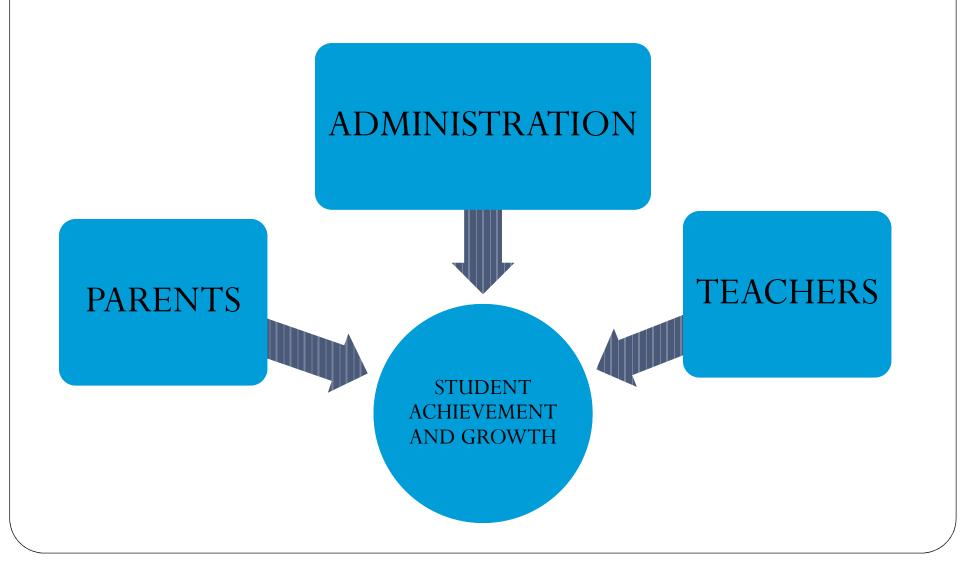

# DIBELS BACKGROUND

- A screening that came into being after 15 years of research at the University of Oregon.
  - It was developed by Dr. Roland Good III and Dr. Ruth Kaminski.
  - It measures the five critical areas of literacy indicated by the National Reading Panel (2000) and the National Research Council (1998).

# 5 BIG IDEAS OF READING

- 1. **Phonemic Awareness** The ability to hear, identify, and work with individual sounds (phonemes) in spoken words.
- 2. Phonics An understanding that there is a relationship between the letters of written language and the sounds of spoken language.
- 3. Fluency The capacity to read text accurately and quickly.
- 4. <u>Vocabulary</u> The knowledge of words that students must possess to communicate effectively.
- **Comprehension** The ability to understand and gain meaning from what has been read.

# WHAT IS DIBELS?

• It is a tool used to identify students who are at risk in the areas of reading.

• Allows us to track student progress throughout their elementary years.

• Gather information that will impact teacher instruction.

# HOW OFTEN IS DIBELS ADMINISTERED?

- The Dibels Assessment is given three times a year
  - September
  - January
  - May

### HOWEVER.....

- Students who are identified to be at risk in the area of reading will be provided intervention to improve deficiencies.
- They will also be assessed every 3 weeks to ensure progress is being made.

# Kindergarten Students

- Letter Naming Fluency Test
  - End of year 40 letters
- Phonemic Awareness Test
- Nonsense Word Fluency Test
  - End of year 25

## • 2<sup>nd</sup> Graders

- Nonsense Word Fluency Test
  - September 50 sounds
- Oral Reading Fluency
  - End of year 90 words

### • 1st Graders

- Letter Naming Fluency
  - Sept. -37 letters
- Phoneme Segmentation Test
  - End of year 35 sounds
- Nonsense Word Fluency
  - End of year 50 sounds
- Oral Reading Fluency
  - End of year 40 words

## • 3<sup>rd</sup> Graders

- Oral Reading Fluency
  - End of year 110 words

# DIBELS ASSESSMENT MEASURES

# WHAT IS LETTER NAMING FLUENCY?

- Assess the students speed of letter naming.
- One minute assessment.
- Assessed in Kindergarten and 1st grade.

# WHAT IS PHONEME SEGMENTATION FLUENCY?

- An assessment that measures a child's skill at breaking words into individual phonemes (sounds).
- One minute assessment.
- Assessed in Kindergarten and 1st grade.

# WHAT IS NONSENSE WORD FLUENCY?

- An assessment that measures a student's Sound-symbol knowledge by measuring phonic decoding skills.
- One minute assessment.
- Kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup>, and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade.

# WHAT IS ORAL READING FLUENCY?

- An assessment that measures the students reading rate and accuracy.
- One minute timed assessment.
- Assessed in 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.

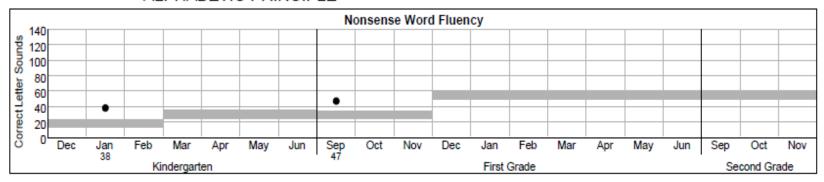


### PHONEMIC AWARENESS



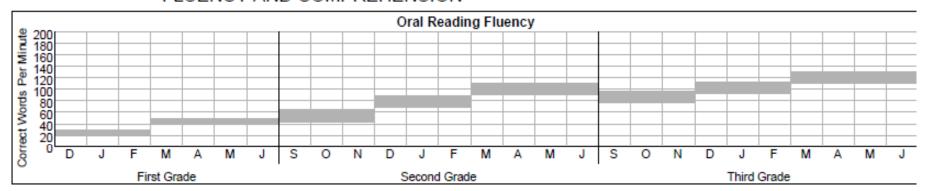


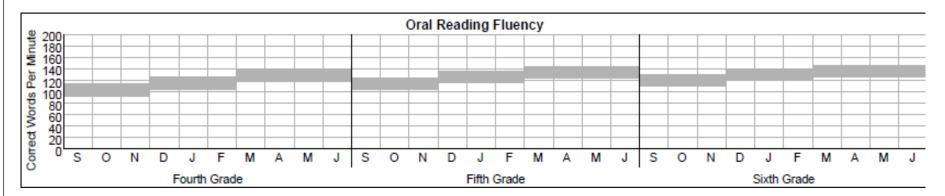
### ALPHABETIC PRINCIPLE

# WHAT DO WE DO WITH THE DATA?

- Students identified as at risk:
  - Provided Instructional Intervention to further develop deficient skills.
  - Progress will be monitored every three weeks. If progress is not evident, time of intervention will be increased or intervention changed.
- Students who achieved benchmark:
  - Provided continual exposure to grade level curriculum
  - Continue to provide opportunities and exposure to literature.
