I am writing to let you know that, Winterfield is a Title I School for 2010-2011 under the federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA). Winterfield is proud to announce that we made AYP in both reading and math. This means that Winterfield has exited School Improvement status under Title I.

Winterfield receives federal funds from the Title I program. These funds help students who are not achieving at grade level in high-poverty schools. As a recipient of these funds, Winterfield is required to make AYP in improving student achievement or face increasingly serious consequences. 57.7% of schools in our district made AYP for 2009-2010.

As a parent of a child in a Title I School you have the right to participate in the decision making process. You are invited to participate on the School Leadership Team, as well as work with the school staff to make decisions regarding the school's School Improvement Plan and Parent Involvement Policy. Winterfield's success is largely attributed to the support we have received from parents and families. We are looking forward to working with you to best serve your child's needs this school year.
