Parent participation in your child's education is very important to us. We know that you have firsthand knowledge about what is needed for your child's education. One way to provide input into your child's education is by participating in a survey. The Bureau of Indian Education (BIE), Division of Performance and Accountability (DPA), is requesting all parents and guardians of students with disabilities that received Special Education and Related Services at BIE-funded schools during school year 2024-2025 to complete the survey. You may participate in this survey through **June 30, 2025** using one of the options below:

3. Submit the paper-copy version attached to your child's school.



Completing the survey is voluntary and the information is confidential. You may request assistance from your child's teacher to complete the survey. Each person who fills out the survey will remain anonymous since there is no request to include your name or other personally identifiable information.

After all the completed parent survey results are tabulated and an analysis is conducted, your child's school will receive information on the status of the school's efforts to include parent involvement in student educational decision making. After the start of the next school year, you can request the information be shared with you.
