<u>Shakopee Police Department Presents:</u> Internet Safety <u>for Parents</u>

Parents, do you know what your kids are doing online? Who they are talking to? What they are talking about?

The Shakopee Police Department will offer a free Internet Safety for Parents presentation on Monday, May 19 to provide parents tools for talking to their children about safe Internet use. The class is from 6 to 8 PM in the Police Department Training Room, 475 Gorman Street; no registration required.

Crime Prevention Specialist Janna Grassel will speak about common apps and websites your children may be using, such as Snapchat, Kilk, Omegle, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, Vine, Ask.fm, Yik Yak and more. The event will also discuss cyber bullying and sexting, was well as provide tips on how to keep your child safer online by increasing parental controls.

The presentation is part of the Department's weeklong campaign on child safety. Throughout the week, the Department will be posting daily child safety tips on Facebook and Twitter. Residents can also stop by the Police Department the week of May 19-23 to pick up a free child ID kit, which includes a fingerprinting card, DNA collection tools and an ID card. Kits are available to the first 100 people. Come to the Police Department lobby between 8 am and 4:30 pm to request a kit.

These activities are in honor of National Missing and Exploited Children's Day, May 25, which, according to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, "celebrates this message of hope and honors the commitment to help locate and recover missing children by reminding parents and communities that every child deserves a safe childhood."
