Daily Schedule

Early Arrivals Students will report to the bus holding classroom on the third grade hall no sooner than 7:20 a.m. and will remain there until 7:45 a.m. Students may bring a water bottle to school per instruction of individual teachers. Lunch money may be brought in daily or credited to the student's account through the cafeteria. All questions regarding lunch account balances should be directed to the cafeteria management.

Daily schedule will vary with teacher.

Grading Policy/Weighting of Grades/Assessments

All grades taken are worth 100 points. Minor grades count 40% while major grades count 60% of final grades. Project grades count as test grades. Progress reports will be sent home midway through each nine-week period. Grading Scale: A=90-100 B=80-89 C=70-79 D=60-69 U=59 or less. Students are required to write all homework assignments in their agendas.

Homework Policy

Homework is assigned on most days, Monday through Thursday. Students are expected to complete the assignments and return them to school the next day. Failure to do so will result in moving a clip for not completing a homework assignment.

Missed Work/Make-up Policy

School Policy-Parents may call the school before 9:00 am to request make-up work. This may be picked up in the office after 2:30 pm. Students have 5 days to complete make-up work.
