

A peninsula is a landmass that extends into a body of water. Even though we refer to Europe as a continent, it is a peninsula that extends westward from the great landmass of Asia. Europe is bordered by the Norwegian Sea to the north, the Atlantic Ocean to the west, and the Mediterranean, Black, and Caspian Seas to the south.

Europe's main peninsulas are the Iberian, Italian, and Balkan, located in southern Europe, and the Scandinavian and Jutland, located in northern Europe. The link between these peninsulas has made Europe a dominant economic, social, and cultural force throughout recorded history.
