Additionally, our Math Olympiad team, lead by Mrs. Rusinski, entered a national contest and won "*High Team Achievement*" and placed in the top 10% in the nation! Great job Mathematicians!

Fifth grade students, **Alexis Weber, Elana Weber, and Sarah Han**, were part of a team that entered the "Odyssey of the Mind" competition. Their efforts placed them 1st among all teams from Long Island!

Suffolk Zone's "Outstanding Physical Education Award" went to fifth grade students Nicholas Mercardante and Kristina Spinelli. Great work!

Third grader, **Jonathan Reichfield**, entered the "HHH Teacher's Association Writing Contest" and won first place. Way to go, Jonathan!

Summer Reading Program

One priority of our literacy program is encouraging independent reading. Research shows that students who do not read over the summer suffer reading loss. In June's report card envelope, you will be receiving a summer reading packet. The packet will include grade appropriate book suggestions, and four response templates with choices for reading responses. Students who read and return the required four responses to their **NEW CLASSROOM TEACHERS** in September will be recognized with a certificate, a bookmark keepsake, and a coupon for a "treat". In addition, Vanderbilt will dedicate a bulletin board to display their work.
