## **ELECTION DAY AT VANDERBIL**

The third grade students at Vanderbilt enjoyed learning about the election process this month. By integrating our "character study" reading unit with our study of the election process, students were truly engaged in an enriching experience.

During Reader's Workshop, students identified character traits for a particular character they were studying. They learned how to use the text to find supportive evidence of a particular trait that they had identified. Students used this knowledge base to then describe traits that a presidential candidate would have. Through a series of mini-lessons, students chose a character from a read-aloud that would be a good candidate for president. Cooperative learning groups created a campaign, wrote a speech, and presented their campaign to other third grade classes. After a student vote, the election results were in! Ask your third-grader which candidate was chosen in their class!



Election Day was an amazing day in history. 4-SU, and many other classes at Vanderbilt were fortunate enough to be part of living history because of technology.

After hearing Barak Obama's speech, I was inspired to share this historical moment with my class. I searched his speech on the Internet, plugged in my projector to my laptop and BAM! There he was in living color on the large screen. It was amazing! This would not have been possible without the laptop program. As a class we took notes. Discussed out feelings, answered questions and had an amazing discussion. We also wrote entries in our Writers Notebooks documenting this moment in history.
