# Principal's Message... Ms. Wandnetta McCray

Welcome to another new and exciting year at Pungoteague Elementary School. I am looking forward to working with all teachers, parents, and community professionals to ensure the best education possible for our students! I am proud of the hard work, dedication, and commitment shown by the students, teachers, and staff of PES each day!

Please be aware that we are enforcing the new "Student Release Policy" in Accomack County Public Schools. This means that any adult coming to release a student from PES will be required to show photo identification. Students will not be released to any adult without showing his/her photo identification. In addition, parents and guardians must complete an "Authorization for Pick Up" yellow form and submit it to our secretary in the front office. This form has to list the adults you deem have permission to pick up your child. If this form is not completed, then your child has to be transported home by his/her regular bus route. If you need to make a change to the form that you previously submitted, then you (parent/ guardian) will need to come to the school and complete another form. Please remember that there will be no verbal communication accepted as a bus pass, student pick up, or car rider. If you have any questions about this new policy, please contact me and I will be glad to further assist you.

All teachers and staff are here to help provide the best education possible for your child. In order to do this, we need your child in class each day. Please make every effort to have your child at school by 8:30 a.m. each day. Instruction starts promptly at 8:30 daily. When your child is tardy or late coming to school, he/ she is missing Reading or Math instruction. The more time he/ she misses from this instruction, the greater the chances that your child will fall behind in his/ her learning and have to "play catch up". Also, when your child is being picked up from school frequently in the afternoon, he/she is still missing valuable instructional time in Reading or Math. This will impact your child's education. Please stay mindful of this when scheduling doctor's appointments, etc. We value and invest in your child's education daily and we need him/her here during the whole day in order to ensure academic success.

Please continue to make sure your child reads at home each night. This will help him/her become better, fluent readers! Thank you for your continued support and please make sure you stay in frequent contact with your child's teacher regularly.

Again, I appreciate all of the hard work, support, and dedication you show to the students, teachers, and staff of PES!

It is hard to believe the first month of school is already over. Kindergarten has been hard at work learning the letters of the alphabet along with the sound that each one makes. We have been practicing how to write our letters, names, and numbers. In Math, we have introduced shapes and will continue learning about 2-D and 3-D shapes. We have also been counting objects and writing numbers to fifteen. We will continue to work on number sense and positional words. Please keep in mind that the weather is changing. First grade is off to a great year so far! We are currently studying addition in math. Please help your child count and write numbers by 1s, 5s, and 10s. In reading, it is very important that each child knows his or her letter names and sounds. We are reviewing word families and learning to read by a strategy called "chunking." If they know their letter sounds, they will be able to "chunk" easier. Also, if students still don't have headphones, please send them in!

#### Super Second Grade! Mrs. Sue Ingram

Welcome to Second Grade! This is an exciting year of learning for our students. This is the year they become readers and critical thinkers. A home-school connection is essential for success. Students need to read nightly with an adult as part of their homework routine. Each student may borrow 2 library books a week to help with this task. This also benefits your child to complete the AR test requirement the homeroom teacher has set. During math we will be concentrating on memorizing addition facts, looking for patterns in a series of numbers, and understanding a value of a number with 3 digits. Take time to talk about books and numbers while you are cooking dinner, shopping or just sharing some quiet time together. Our Second Grade team is ready to assist you in any way we can.

#### Terrific Third Grade! Mrs. Julie Elliott

Third grade students had a GREAT time on the Duncan Farm Field trip. The weather was perfect and everyone enjoyed learning about agriculture. Did you see the article in the Eastern Shore News? If you missed it, check out the link on the PES webpage. Students are also learning about our world and where the continents and oceans are located. In reading, the focus has been on finding the main idea and author's purpose after reading stories. How big is an inch? How do you measure length? What else do we measure and why is this important? Students are exploring the measurement of length, weight, time, temperature, and liquids in math class. Let your child help out in the kitchen so they can participate in measuring at home. The Third Grade team encourages all parents and guardians to read and listen to your child read each night at home.

Fourth graders are off to a fabulous start! We are going back 400 plus years and studying Virginia History. In math we are busy learning how to "show and tell" answers to multi-step problems. Planners should be signed by parents nightly to confirm that students are completing their homework. Look for weekly papers and information in Monday folders.
