Dear Parents and Guardians,

With the last day of school just two short weeks away, I wanted to take a moment to highlight some of the activities and celebrations that will occur prior to the end of school.

The 8th Grade Dance will take place today, Friday, June 9th, from 6:00pm-8:00pm. Parents must drop off students in the back of the Hilltop/playground entrance starting at 6:00 pm. Pick up is in front of MVMS promptly at 8:00 pm. As a gentle reminder, the recognition dance is not a formal event. Students are encouraged to dress comfortably. In the past, most students chose to wear khaki style shorts, polo shirts, short-sleeve button up shirts (with or without a tie), skirts or sun dresses. **Students must be in attendance on June 9**th to attend the dance. **Students may not be dismissed prior to 2:00.**

On June 15th, we will continue to celebrate our 8th grade class by hosting the 8th Grade Promotion Ceremony at St. Anselm Sullivan Arena, beginning at 2:00pm. Thursday, June 15th will be a remote learning day for all 8th grade students. Students will be encouraged to attend a Microsoft Teams meeting with their team teachers beginning at 9:00. This meeting will include reminders about the promotional ceremony and a fun, virtual team activity. Students must arrive at the Sullivan Arena at 1:15 (and assemble in the hallway under the bleachers.) Seating is first come, first serve, please do not save seats. At the end of the ceremony, students will meet guests at their seats. We ask that all guests leave the property soon after the completion of our ceremony to allow for the preparation of GHS (Goffstown High School) Graduation occurring later that evening.

In addition to the 8th Grade Dance and Promotion, we will also be hosting our annual Field Day on Wednesday, June 14th, where all students, in each grade, will be able to engage in a variety of activities and many outdoor backyard games. Please send your student to school with a water bottle, sneakers, sunscreen, and bug spray, as they will be outside for most of the day.

As this is the last edition of the Paws News for the 2022-2023 school year, I want to take a moment to share how fortunate I have been to be the Principal of Mountain View Middle School this year. It has been a privilege to get to know you and your students. For those of you returning to us next year, I look forward to another year of working together to make MVMS one of the best middle schools in the state of New Hampshire. Robotics and STEM Enrichment Activity at MVMS

We are excited to share that SAU #19 is offering a one-week intensive enrichment opportunity focused on Robotics and STEM related activities at Mountain View Middle School during the week of 6/26-6/29 from 8 AM to 3 PM. These two programs will run separately, but in tandem, so that each cohort of students are able to spend two days in each activity. The two cohorts will be broken up accordingly: Incoming 5th graders to MVMS (those students currently at Maple and Bartlett), as well as our current students at MVMS who are in 5th grade and will be entering 6th grade in the fall will be one cohort. The second cohort will consist of those MVMS students who will be seventh and eighth graders at MVMS in the fall, including those students at NBCS. These free enrichment programs will help support the grade level and school level transition for interested students by providing a purposeful and enriching activity while also offering students a familiarity with the building and some of MVMS's teaching staff. Nurse Update: Attention 6th Grade Parents

The State of NH requires all students entering 7th grade to receive the **Tdap** vaccine (Tetanus and Pertussis) prior to the start of 7th grade. Most children receive this vaccine between ages 10-12. Many current 6th graders are still missing documentation of this vaccine. If your child received this vaccine, we ask that you send in a copy of their immunization record prior to the end of the school year. If your student has not had the Tdap vaccine, please make arrangements with your child's health care provider for him/ her to receive this vaccine before the start of school in September and submit a copy of your student's vaccine record to the MVMS nurses once completed. Nature's Classroom



During Nature's Classroom, students and staff engage in a full day of team-building, wilderness training, camouflaging, and orienteering activities across the many diverse outdoor spaces at MVMS, including the fields, trails, and stream.

Stephen Hale is the Project Director of UNH Leitzel Center for Mathematics, Science, and Engineering Education. Mr. Lee has been fortunate enough to be able to work at UNH for the past 4 summers doing a program called RETE (Research Experience for Teachers of Engineering) He has learned quite a bit of new technologies and has applied some of what he have learned through posters and new projects integrated in the classroom. The newest project, he has been focused on is seacoast erosion and preventatives. As a model for students to be able to see these affects and test the different types of preventatives, UNH has graciously donated us \$1250 dollars towards a giant Fish tank. Mr. Lee will be building a custom wave creator on one side of the tank and have an inclined plane leading up to a beach on the other side of the tank. The waves will erode the beach and students will create different types of beach erosion preventatives to see how they hold up to the continuous barrage of waves.

If you don't use our portal to make online meal payments, you can set up a free account to view previous transactions, set spending limits, transfer funds between students, set low-balance notifications and more. It's an easy way to manage your child's meal account.

Also, if your student is changing schools within the district and has money on the account, the money will move with him/her. If you need a refund as your student is leaving the district and your child's account has \$10 or more left, please click on this link https://tinyurl.com/en9cyvzd to complete the form. 


