Revolving Fund Manual

"A revolving fund separately accounts for specific revenues and earmarks them for expenditure by a board or officer without appropriation for particular purposes to support the activity, program or service that generated the revenues. Typically, revolving funds are authorized by state law for programs or services with expenses that (1) fluctuate with demand and (2) can be matched with the fees, charges or other revenues collected during the year. The board or officer with authority to spend from a revolving fund can only incur liabilities and spend from the available, unspent and unencumbered balance of actual collections."¹

For clarification purposes Student Activity funds and Scholarship funds are not revolving funds. Those are Fiduciary Trust Funds that are guided by criteria established when originally established. Student Activity funds are governed by the respective School Principal and the City Treasurer and Scholarships are governed by an established Scholarship Committee.²
