Revolving Fund Manual

"A revolving fund separately accounts for specific revenues and earmarks them for expenditure by a board or officer without appropriation for particular purposes to support the activity, program or service that generated the revenues. Typically, revolving funds are authorized by state law for programs or services with expenses that (1) fluctuate with demand and (2) can be matched with the fees, charges or other revenues collected during the year. The board or officer with authority to spend from a revolving fund can only incur liabilities and spend from the available, unspent and unencumbered balance of actual collections."¹

For clarification purposes Student Activity funds and Scholarship funds are not revolving funds. Those are Fiduciary Trust Funds that are guided by criteria established when originally established. Student Activity funds are governed by the respective School Principal and the City Treasurer and Scholarships are governed by an established Scholarship Committee.²

ATHLETICS (34640)	
Purpose:	The Athletic Revolving Fund was established to manage financials related to student participation in competitive team sports in adherence to Massachusetts Inter-scholastic Athletic Association (MIAA) rules and School Committee policies. Revenues consist of student athletic participation fees, gate receipts, tournament fees and donations from parent, booster and community groups. Monies in the revolving fund may be used to pay for coaching stipends, officials, equipment, supplies and contract services such as transportation and rental of facilities such as ice rinks.

CHROMEBOOK FEE (34629)

Purpose:	<p>For every student issued a district-owned Chromebook there is an expectation of proper care and awareness of the responsibilities for the device while at school and when using the device outside of school. Each student must complete a registration process and pay a technology fee each year. Payments are not considered a deposit and fees are not returned at the end of the school year. The Technology Chromebook revolving fund was established to record the collection of fees and to document related expenditures. The revolving fund was originally titled just "Chromebook" but the title has been expanded to allow other aspects to be incorporated in the future.</p> <p>The fee covers most repairs, but intentional damage and lost devices can incur additional fees. If a device is believed to be stolen and a police report is provided, there are no fees for replacement. Loss of Device or Loss of Charger will incur an additional fee. The district Technology Department is an Acer certified repair shop and repairs are either completed in-house or the unit is shipped back to the manufacturer to be fixed. Funds are used for annual lease payments for the District's Chromebook program and for anything required to help maintain & fund technology needs in general.</p>

CIRCUIT BREAKER (34422)

Purpose:	<p>In Massachusetts public school districts are reimbursed for eligible costs associated students receiving specialized services under an Individual Education Plan (IEP). After reviewing applications submitted by the school district the Circuit Breaker (CB) program will reimburse up to 75% of the cost of Special Education students that exceed four times (4x) the state average foundation amount established by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) each year. The annual funding of CB reimbursements is "subject to legislative appropriation" and historically reimbursements range between 70%-75% of qualified costs.</p> <p>In accordance with Commonwealth laws and regulations funds are managed in a separate Revolving Fund and all state reimbursements must be credited to the fund. Funds may only be used to offset high tuition costs for students in outside placements. All reimbursable expenses should be either charged directly to or transferred in to the fund. Reimbursements are made quarterly and the 4th quarter reimbursement (often received after July 1st) should be accrued as of June 30. If the final reimbursement does not equal the receivable, the difference must be charged to the next fiscal year budget.</p>

E-RATE (34225)

Purpose:	<p>The E-Rate revolving fund is used to record reimbursements received by the District and to track related expenditures. The Federal Schools and Libraries Program known as E-Rate is a Universal Service Fund program designed to help public schools and libraries gain access to affordable telecommunication services and high-speed Internet access issued in two ways.</p> <p>Category 1 services defined by the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) as services that provide the basic conduit access to the Internet. The Peabody School District annually receives a check that covers 60% of the cost for local Internet Service provider (ISP) and the District covers the remaining 40%.</p> <p>Category 2 services are those needed to enable high-speed broadband connectivity and broadband internal connections components. The Peabody School District applies these monies toward the Network Infrastructure (Switches, WAPs, etc.) along with wireless access points. The District historically applies the funds for Category 2 and covers the remaining 40% out of either Capital or the IT Department budget.</p>

Purpose:	<p>The Facilities Usage funds are fees collected from any outside group renting a school facility (i.e. gymnasium, library, cafeteria, classroom, etc.). Use of school facilities by community groups (i.e. basketball leagues, etc.) and private organizations (i.e. Boy Scouts, etc.) is allowed as long as the activities do not detract from the educational experience or place an unnecessary burden on ensuring that school facilities are adequately maintained. Funds collected are to be used for the upkeep of property or equipment.</p> <p>Within the District the majority of Facilities Usage funds are received from the For Kids Only (FKO) after-school program (https://fkoafterschool.org/).</p>

FOOD SERVICE (06904)		
Purpose:	<p>The Food Service revolving fund tracks revenues and expenditures associated with the school breakfast and lunch program. The Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) administers the USDA School Lunch program. The Bureau of Nutrition Education sets regulations for accounting and auditing the federal School Lunch program and the USDA also provides federal commodities.</p> <p>The Food Service revolving fund tracks all revenues and expenses with the exception of employee benefits which are charged to the general fund. School cafeterias operate point-of-sale (POS) systems which encompass use of cash registers, cash handling, and daily balancing of monies. Meals are prepared at each school and the Cafeteria staff is responsible for maintaining safe stores of new and left-over food product.</p>

GIFTS & DONATIONS

Purpose:	<p>The Gift & Donation Revolving Fund is used when local organizations generously donate funds to provide supplemental support to the schools either for general use or for a specific purpose. Each school and department has their own gift account with all Function Codes starting with "35x". If a gift is donated with a specific purpose stated then the funds can only be used for that purpose (i.e. paying for student field trips, etc.). If funds are donated without any restrictions then the funds may be used without any limitations.</p> <p>The Commonwealth provides guidance on gift giving to public school teachers and staff. A public employee may not accept any gift worth \$50 or more unless it is disclosed in writing. As an example if a Parent-Teacher Organization (PTO) wants to give \$75 gift cards to teachers to buy classroom supplies, teachers may accept the gift cards but must use them to buy classroom supplies and keep receipts. In this example the supplies bought with the gift cards are the property of the school, not the teachers.</p>

INTEGRATED PRESCHOOL (34602)

Purpose:	<p>The Peabody Public Schools Integrated Preschool Program serves children ages 3-5 years old in an inclusive early childhood setting. The program was created to provide opportunities for children with disabilities to receive specialized instruction and related services within an environment that includes general education peers with developmentally appropriate social/behavioral, communication, early learning, and motor skills. The early childhood educators utilize a thematic approach to curriculum which is directly aligned to the Massachusetts Guidelines for Preschool Learning Experiences and Common Core Standards.</p> <p>Preschool slots are available on a first-come first-serve basis for half days and full days and a specific number of days attending per week. Tuition is based on the hours and days the child attends and for a full-year. To enroll in the Integrated Preschool program the parent must provide a birth certificate, current health and immunization records, proof of residency, and a copy of the parents' license.</p>

LOST BOOKS (34601)

Purpose:	<p>Students are responsible to maintain and return any book or other District property issued to them by any Department (i.e. textbooks, Chromebooks, equipment, etc.). The returned item must be the exact same item that was issued or an item of equal value as determined by the School Principal. Students who lose or damage any school property issued to them must reimburse the school for the full restitution. Students with outstanding obligations will be placed on internal suspension.</p> <p>These revolving funds serve to track revenues received from students and parents who are required to reimburse the schools for any accidental or deliberate damage to school property. These funds are used to buy replacement equipment, or replace lost books or to repair or replace broken windows or other damage caused by one or more students. Corresponding expenditures are made out of this fund to purchase replacement books and/or materials and/or to make necessary repairs.</p>

The PVMHS Tanner Squadron (MA-951) is committed to the Air Force Core Values of "integrity first," "service before self," and "excellence in all we do."</p> <p>The revolving fund was established to record revenues receives and expenses paid out in relation to the Minimum Instructor Pay (MIP) for an instructor as stipulated by the Defense Finance Accounting Service (DFAS). The pay reflects the difference between active duty pay that a ROTC instructor would receive if ordered to active duty. Schools employing ROTC instructors are reimbursed by the Army for one half of the calculated minimum instructor pay. The total amount paid by the school is taxable income.</p>

SCHOOL CHOICE (34633)

Purpose:	<p>The Massachusetts School Choice program allows parents to send their children to schools in communities other than the city or town in which they reside. The program is intended to cover costs associated with student's attending classes in the District. Tuition is paid by the sending district to the receiving district. Districts may elect not to enroll school choice students if no space is available.</p> <p>The School Choice revolving fund is used to track revenues received from the state and corresponding expenditures. If funds are not used for direct services they may be used for expenses that enhance current educational programs for students. State regulations do not allow School Choice funds to be transferred to non-educational related areas of the school budget.</p> <p>If a District no longer accepts School Choice students then their tuition-in revenues will continually decrease as existing tuition-in students graduate and are not replaced by new tuition-in students in lower grades. In FY22 Peabody will receive approximately \$370K in School Choice tuition-in revenues and will experience a decrease of approximately -10% in revenues annually and will no longer receive School Choice tuition-in revenues after FY30.</p>

STUDENT PARKING FEES (34627)

Purpose:	<p>At the Peabody Memorial Veterans High School (PVMHS) students may park in assigned spaces after purchasing a parking permit. The Student Parking Fee revolving fund was established to record the collection of parking fees and to document related expenditures.</p> <p>Student parking is on a first-come first-served basis in the red numbered spots. TRANSPORTATION FEE (34626)

Purpose:	<p>State regulations mandate that the District transport students in grades K-6 who live more than 2.0 miles from the school they attend. The District may provide transportation to students in grades K-6 who live less than 2.0 miles from the school, or those who are enrolled in grades 7-12, but is not under legal mandate to do so. The District may charge for this optional transportation service and transportation revenues and fees are managed through the Transportation revolving fund.</p> <p>The Peabody School District authorized a "Pay to Ride" program for students who live in the "walk zone" (i.e. within 2-miles from school). Bus ridership is granted on a first come, first serve space available basis. Options include round trip or one-way for the entire year starting in October. Fees must be paid in full but financial hardship applications are available. Upon acceptance a bus pass will be mailed to the student's home and must be shown upon entering the bus. Riders will be assigned to an existing bus route and bus stop and no exceptions will be made.</p>
