Goal: Upgrade your Google Slides to make it more interactive, guide your students through your presentation, all while conducting checks for understanding (formative assessment).
Choose the Add-On while in Slides.

Pear Deck is an add-on to Google Slides. This means Slides have to be open. [Watch here.](#)

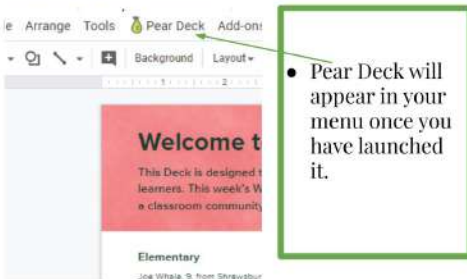
Launching Pear Deck:

1. Open the Google Slide presentation that you would like to update **or** start from scratch by opening a blank slide.
2. Then choose **Pear Deck** in your Menu bar.
3. If Pear Deck does not appear in your menu- bar, be sure to sync your account.
4. Go to your profile to sync your account.
5. If you still have trouble, please contact your technology coordinator.

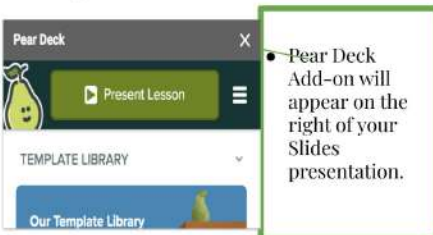
Start with in Google Slides

Starting Pear Deck

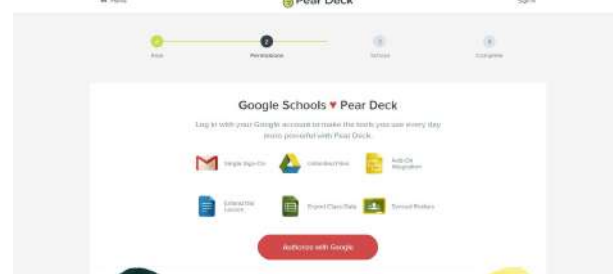

Go to peardeck.com and sign in to Teacher Login
Choose your role and use your school account.



Designing your Pear Deck

1. You have the option to choose *basic slides* and then customize them on your own **OR** simply find them in the **Template Library** * *I strongly suggest you start with the template library.*

There are 6 Types of Questions found in the Template Library. They can be found under "Ask Students a Question"

1. *Text*
2. *Multiple Choice*
3. *Numbers*
4. *Draw*
5. *Draggable*
6. *Website*

Finding Templates in the Template Library

1. Social Emotional
2. Social Studies
3. ELA
4. Science
5. World Language
6. Math
7. Beginning of Lesson, During, End
8. Instruction Slides
9. Transition Slides

Modifying the Templates by the type of question

1. Be sure the slide is selected
2. Then choose "Ask Students a Question"
3. Choose the one you want
4. Double check in the notes area on the bottom of the slide
5. Modify the slide as needed

Presenting your Pear Deck Session

- *You will choose PRESENT on Pear Deck rather than the actual presentation.*
- *Wait for all students to join before presenting*
- *Use the link or the code (Code expires after 5 min, so best to use the link)*
- *Show /Hide Responses during the session*
- *Delete responses via Teacher Dashboard*
- *Add slides during the presentation "on the fly" using Pear Pops [Watch here](#)*
- *Turn on Closed Caption is an option, but has to be before the session starts.*

****Tips for Using Google Meet with Pear Deck [Watch here](#)**

- *Present your Window rather than your entire Desktop*
- *Use a second device to present the Teacher Dashboard or use split screens to see the presentation and monitor responses*
- *Ask students to split their screen as well*

Ending Your Session & Using Takeaways

- *Choose to save the session or not*
- *Name It using the Period*

- It will appear in your Drive
- Send to students for reflection
- Go to your main page to view all sessions
- Takeaways can be found in your Google Drive
- Pear Deck automatically creates folders for you
