1. How well does the writer address the task in the introduction? Are both TAGs present?
2. Does the writer's thesis state a clear description of the task? If not, what should be added?
3. Check organization. Does each paragraph start with a topic sentence that clearly states one reason for the writer's position? Which paragraphs need topic sentences?
4. Check evidence. Are there concrete details from BOTH documents? List paragraph numbers which lack details and give suggestions as to what could be added.
5. Check style. Mark awkward sentences, agreement problems, and anything else that does not sound right. Check for mechanical errors.
6. Check the conclusion. Does the author simply restate what they've already said? If so, how can they change the conclusion to reflect a new awareness?
