

Personal Dry Erase Board Project

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As a follow-up to activities in Word, Publisher, PowerPoint, Google Apps, Desktop Publishing, and other packages, your students will enjoy this hands-on activity making their own Personal Dry Erase Boards!

Uses:

Calendars, To-Do Lists, Notes, Reminders, Refrigerator Boards, Upcoming Appointments, and Other Creative Uses

Here is what you will need:

- ✓ Cardstock – White or Color
- ✓ Color Printer
- ✓ Strip of Magnets or Small Circle Ones
- ✓ Velcro (strips or individual attach-ones)
- ✓ Dry Erase Markers (thin ones) – Can be purchased at Dollar Tree or in packs

Here are the steps:

- Decide on what type of personal project you wish to create.
- Search for appropriate images/graphics to include—download to save for use.
- Using the software package, design a sheet using either portrait (8 ½ x 11) or landscape (11 x 8 ½) orientation.
- Design the project. Sketching it first on a sheet of paper may help!
- Include such elements as:
 - Color
 - Borders
 - Images
 - Lines
 - Templates
- When finished, print on card stock (a heavier paper more durable and suitable for laminating).
- Laminate complete project.
- On back, attach small magnets to hold it on place on refrigerator, file cabinet, or other place.
- On front, attach a small piece of Velcro to hold dry erase pen.
- On pen, attach a small piece of Velcro to attach to board.
- Enjoy and use daily!!!! Have fun creating the board!!!
