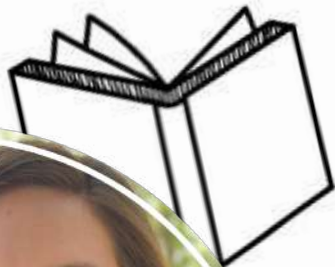

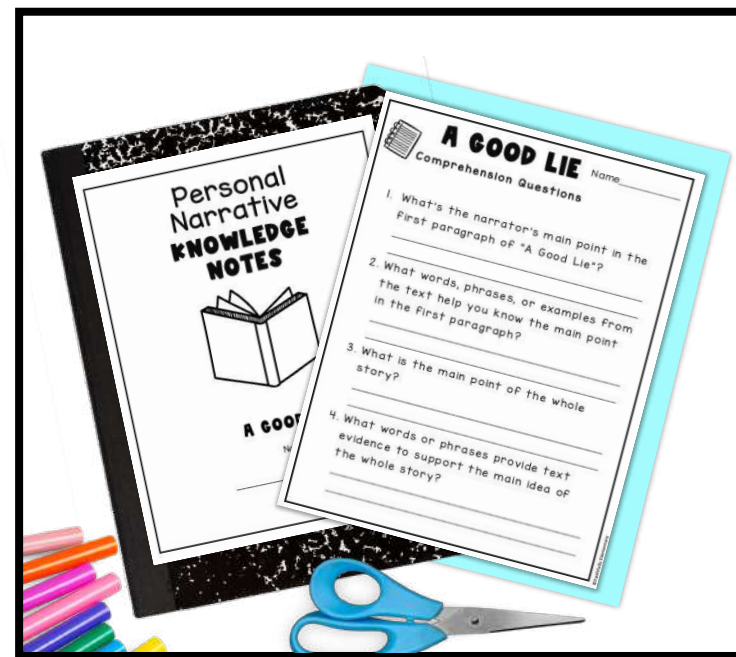
## KNOWLEDGE NOTES

You can pick and choose what pages you want your students to complete in this resource. These extension activities are perfect for small group or independent work. Gives more practice with each literacy skill.

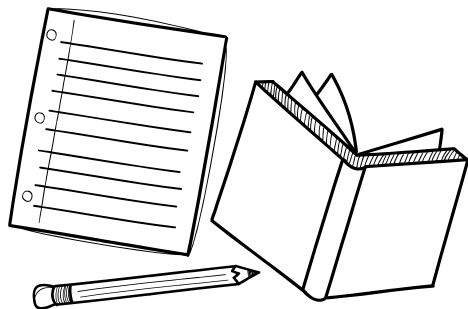

Each lesson focuses on finding text evidence and using the text to complete each activity. Remind students that they must go back to the text to find their answers. They should use the text to help complete each page.

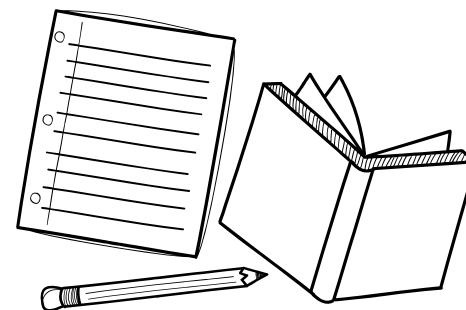
