View Finder

•The small window in the back of the camera is the viewfinder.

 Look though this to compose your photos and focus on your subjects.



LCD Monitor

•After you take a photo, it will be displayed in this monitor in two seconds.



LCD Monitor Shutter Speed

Before you take a photo, the monitor you will see the exposure.
The fraction of a second is the shutter speed.

This is how fast the camera is taking the picture.
Record this on all of your logs.



LCD Monitor F/Stop or Aperture

 The other expose control displayed is the F/Stop.

This is how much light is coming into the camera through the lens.

 Record this on all of your logs.



LCD Monitor Battery Check





- Battery level OK.
- Battery level is slightly down, but adequate power remains.



- : Battery will be exhausted soon.
- Battery must be recharged.



 Check your battery in the monitor.
 The battery chamber is on the bottom of the camera.



Pop Up Flash

•The flash will automatically pop up in the auto settings.

 Simply push it down, when you are done taking a picture.



Focusing Modes on the Lens

- Your lens has two modes:
 AF for Auto Focus
 MF for Manual Focus
 - You will most often use AUTO FOCUS in this class.



- On the lens, set the focus mode switch to <AF> (autofocus).
 - If it is set to <MF> (manual focus), autofocus will not operate.

Taking a Picture

Shutter Button

The shutter button has two steps. You can press the shutter button halfway. Then you can further press the shutter button completely.



Pressing halfway

This activates autofocusing and automatic exposure metering that sets the shutter speed and aperture. The exposure setting (shutter speed and aperture) is displayed in the viewfinder. ($(\bar{O}4)$)



This releases the shutter and takes the picture.



Fully Auto Mode

- •Set the mode dial to the green square.
- •This mode will pick the Optimal brightness and contrast.
- •The automatic flash may pop up.



Portrait Auto Mode

•Set the mode dial to the Lady Head.

•This mode blurs the background to make the human subject stand out.





Landscape Auto Mode

•Set the mode dial to the mountain.

•This mode makes everything in focus from near to far.





Close Up Auto Mode

- •Set the mode dial to the flower.
- •This mode is good for photographing small things close up.



Moving Subject Auto Mode

- •Set the mode dial to the runner.
- •This mode will freeze (or Stop) the action of a moving subject.
