Take a series of photos that show repetition and pattern.

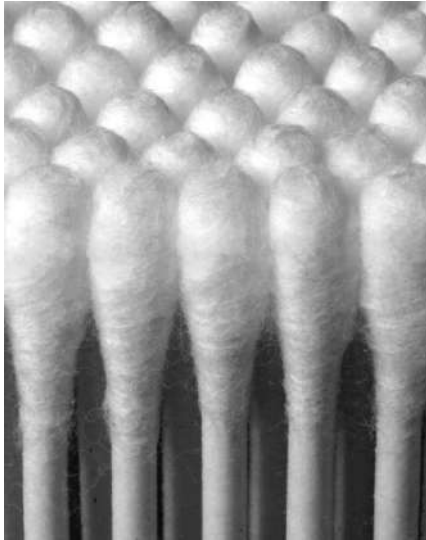
Repetition

A repeated decorative design.

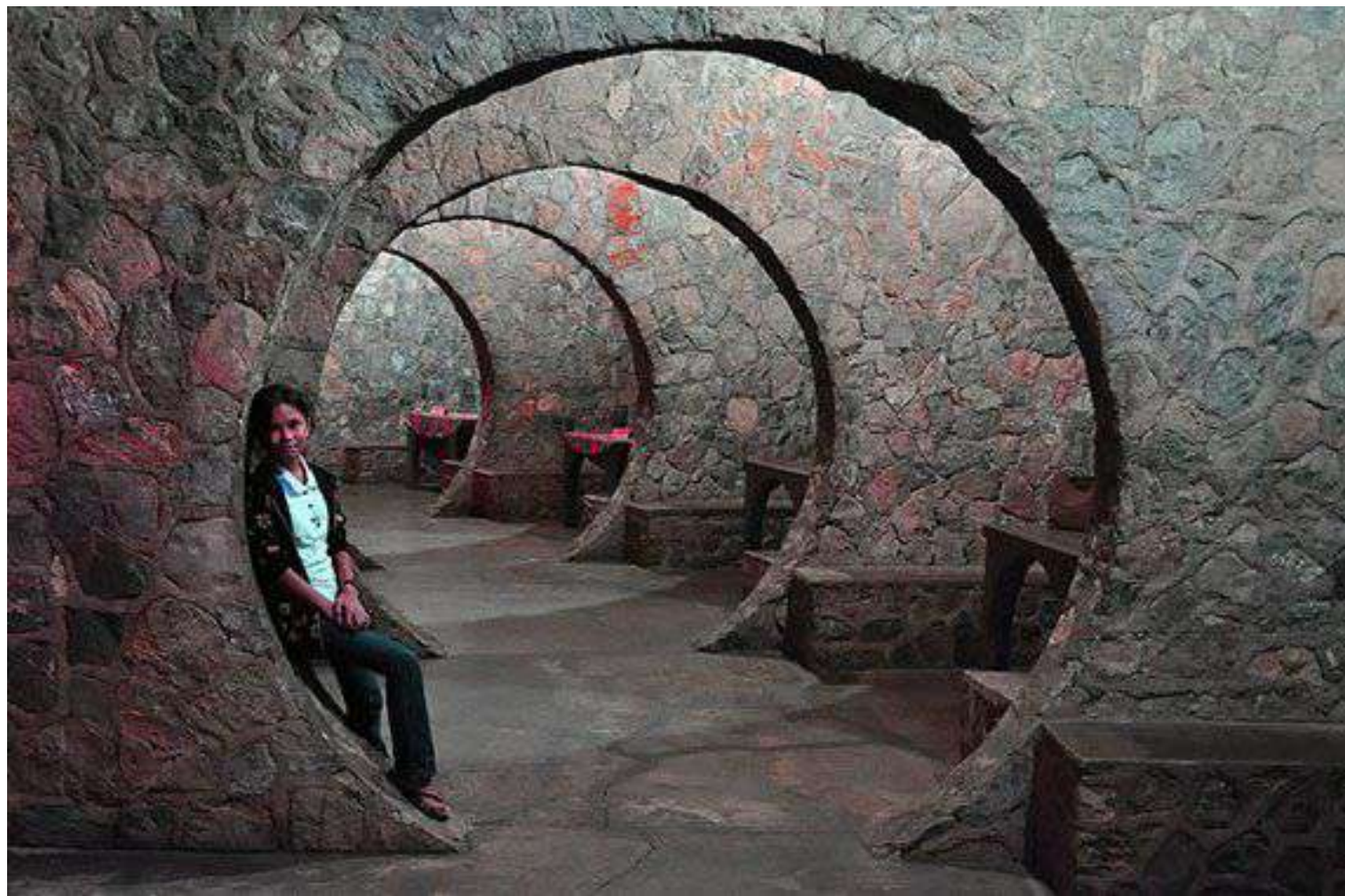


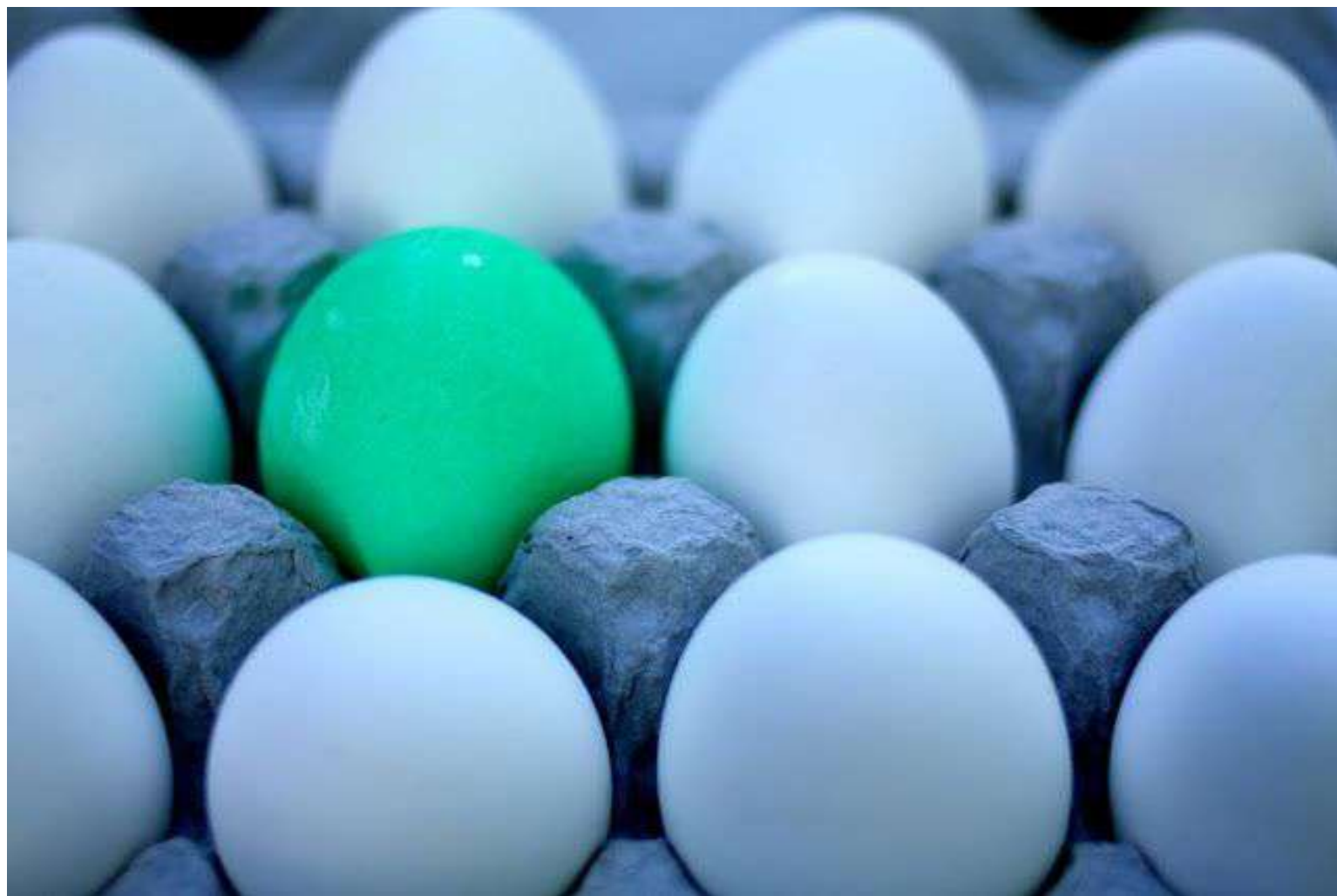




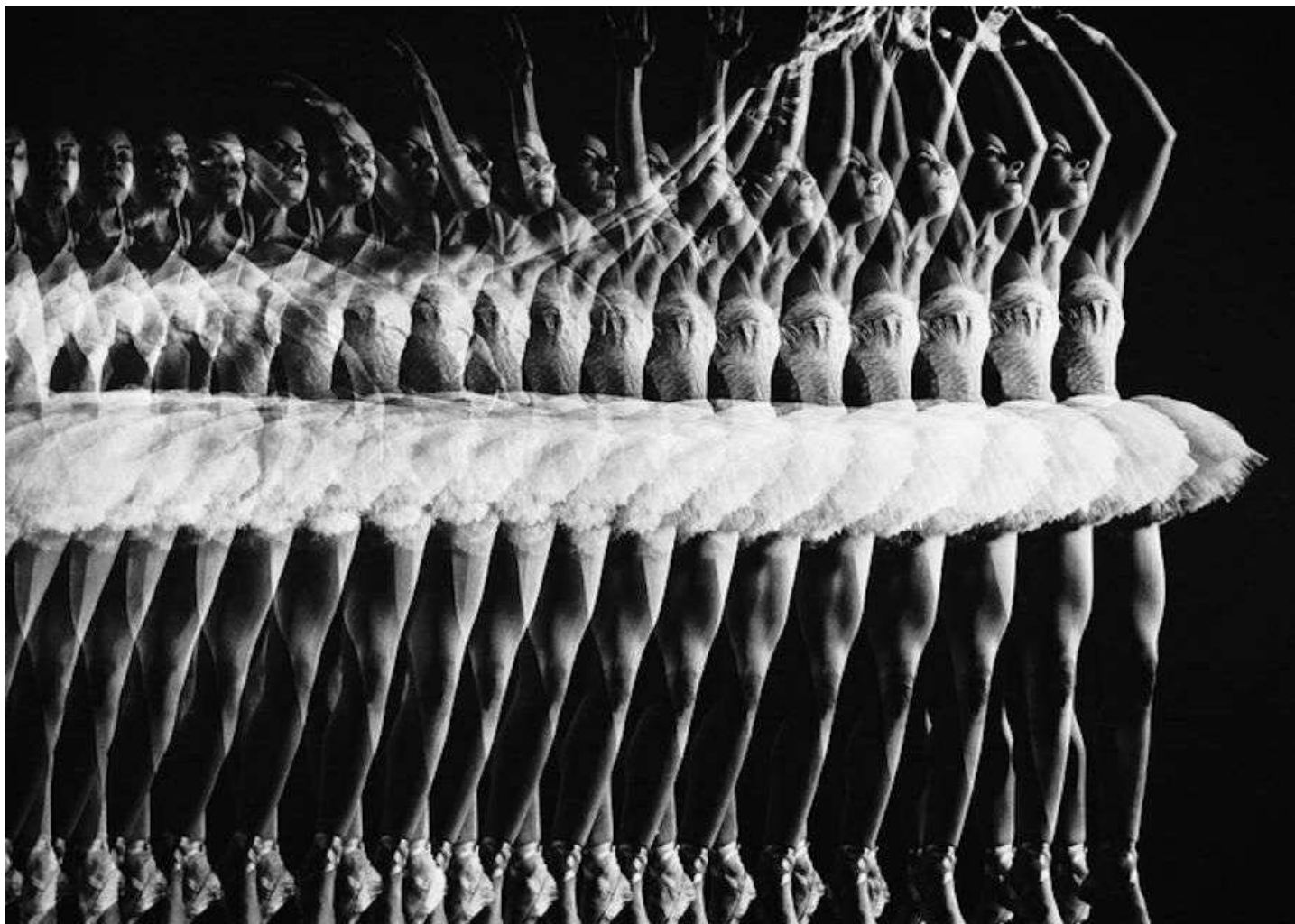














Assignment

You may use any other solid surface as your background.

You may go on campus to find natural patterns and repetition.

You will set up at least 4-5 different scenarios for your 20+ photos.

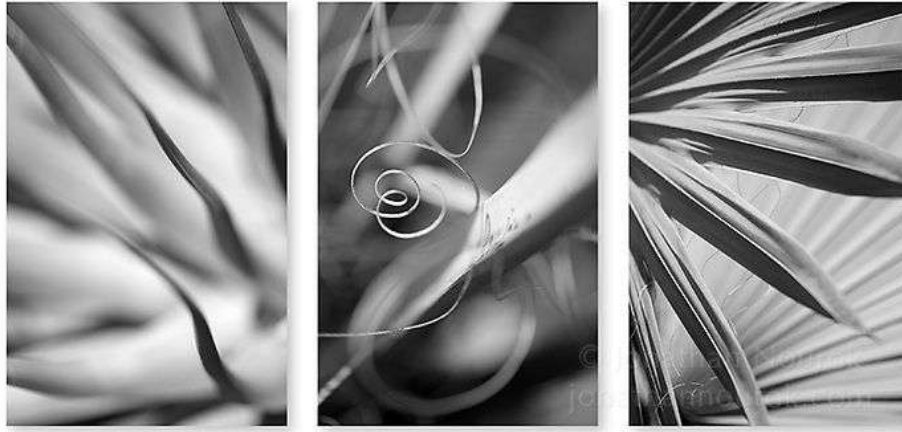

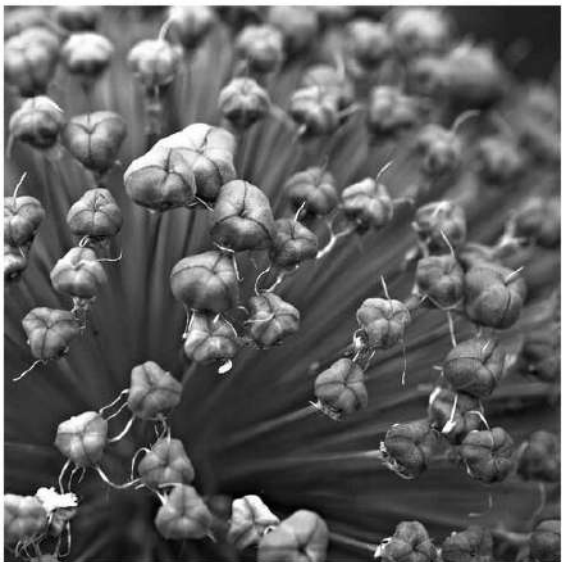

What is a Triptych?

-a set of three associated artistic, literary, or musical works intended to be appreciated together.











How do I make one?

Just like with our Kaleidoscope project, you'll be resizing your images to fit on a new Photoshop document.

Your 3 favorite images for this project should all be oriented the same direction.

For 3 Vertical images: Make a new document 12" wide by 6" tall.

For 3 Horizontal images: Make a new document 18" wide by 4" tall.

Resize your favorite three images to 4x6 @300. The short side should be 4". So if your image is horizontal, it will be 4" tall and if it's vertical, it should be 4" wide.

Move all three images to the new PS document. Your images will not have any space between them.

Flatten LAYER>FLATTEN your document. Keep in color, or desaturate for a more artistic feel, or adjust each layer as you wish.
