Mosaic Art & the Byzantine Empire

AIM: How Can We Compare Modern Mosaic Art to that of the Byzantine Empire?

TASK A: Read Introduction

A mosaic is an art form made with small pieces of colored glass, stone, or other materials. Individual pieces are called tesserae. They fit together to form a design, which is set in mortar. Mosaics can decorate ceilings, floors, walls, sidewalks, and furniture.

People of many cultures have used mosaic art. Mosaics appeared as early as 3000 BCE and became widespread during 300 BCE in cities ruled by Greece. In the 6th century, mosaics were a popular art form in the Byzantine Empire. Islamic people of India and Persia, the Aztec and Mayan Indians, and Mexicans in modern times have all created mosaic art.

TASK C: Using Photoshop create a Mosaic Portrait of yourself, a famous celebrity or even your favorite animal! Use the following guidelines/directions for your project:


- 1. Open Google Images and search for a picture. Save it to
- 2. Open the image of into the Adobe **Photoshop** program using the **File Men**u, **Open** Command
- 3. Click the Layer Menu and New Layer from Background, type Mosaic Person as the layer name.
- 4. Save the File as Mosaic Person
- 5. Click File New Blank File
- 6. Click the **Gradient** tool
- 7. Choose a **multicolored** background from the Gradient and **drag** the mouse **onto** the **workspace** area.
- 8. Name the layer BKG using the directions listed in step 4
- 9. Apply Mosaic Tile Filter using the Filter, Texture, Mosaic Tile Command.
- 10. Save the File as Mosaic Background
- Click the Mosaic Person and remove the background with the Magic Wand Tool




- 12. If necessary, deselect the image using the Select Menu, Deselect command.

- 16. Use the Text Tool to type your name on the background
- 17. If necessary, move your name into final place, change font type, size and/or color.
- 17. Resave your file(s)
