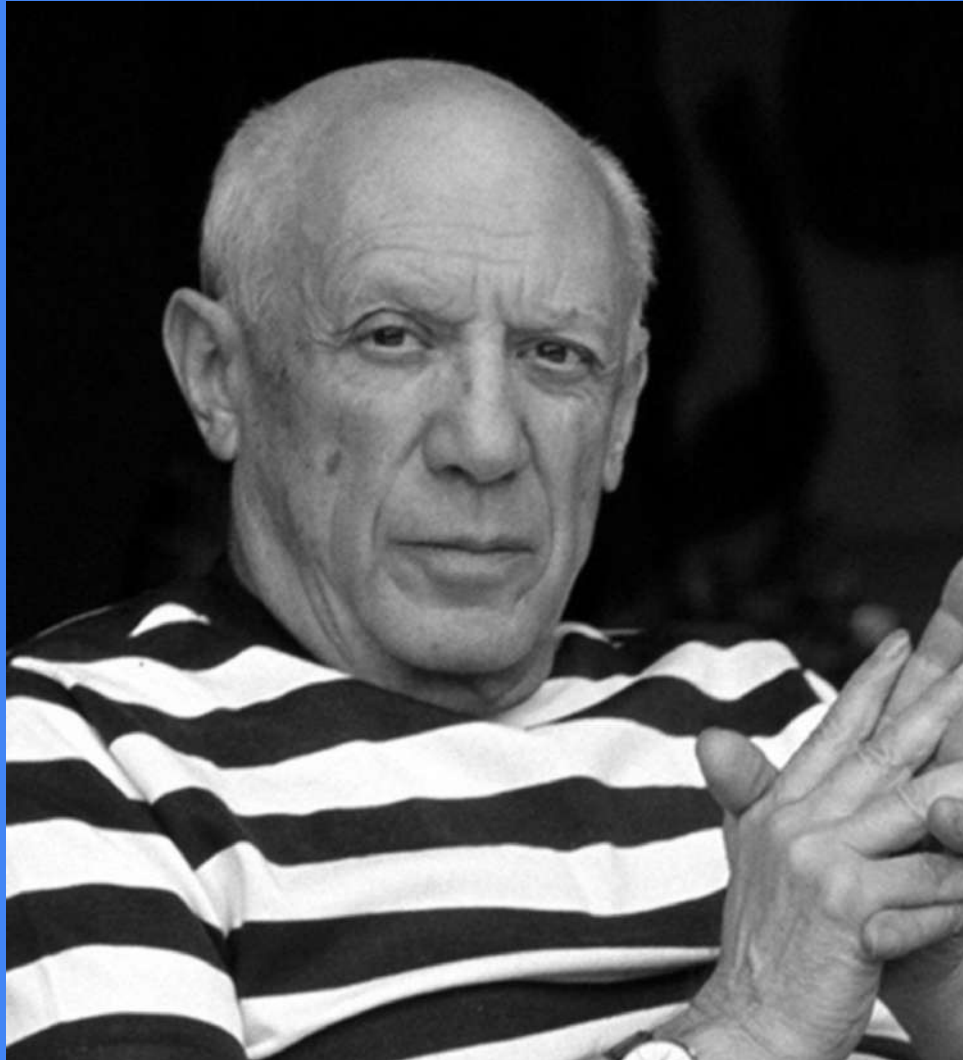

Pablo Picasso

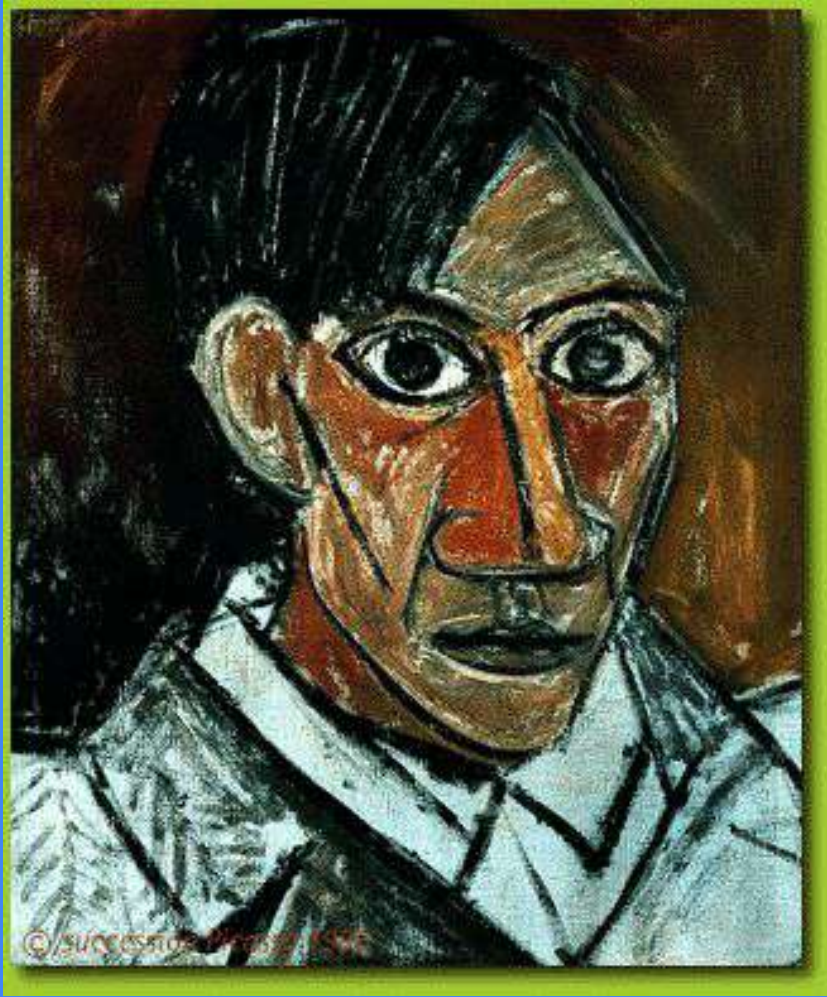


Pablo Picasso spent most of his adult life in France.

Pablo Ruiz Picasso



- ◆ Picasso was born in Spain on October 25, 1881.
- ◆ He began to draw when he was 7 years old.
- ◆ His father was an art teacher.
- ◆ He is one of the most famous artist of the 20th century.
- ◆ He died in 1973.
- ◆ He has 3 museums dedicated to his work. One is in Spain and the Picasso Museum, and Picasso Museum in France.



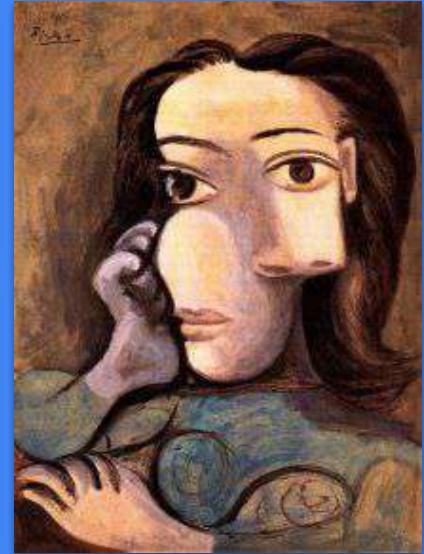
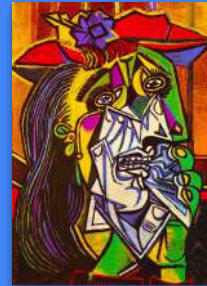
Vocabulary

Portrait: The drawing or painting of a particular person.

Geometric Shapes: Are precise forms such as squares, circles, triangles and rectangles.

Cubism: An artistic style, that describes paintings of a person, place or thing that are made of geometric shapes and many different perspectives.

Abstract: Art that changes realistic things into un-realistic things by using patterns and shapes. Sometimes they become so un-realistic that you cannot even recognize what they are (non-representational).

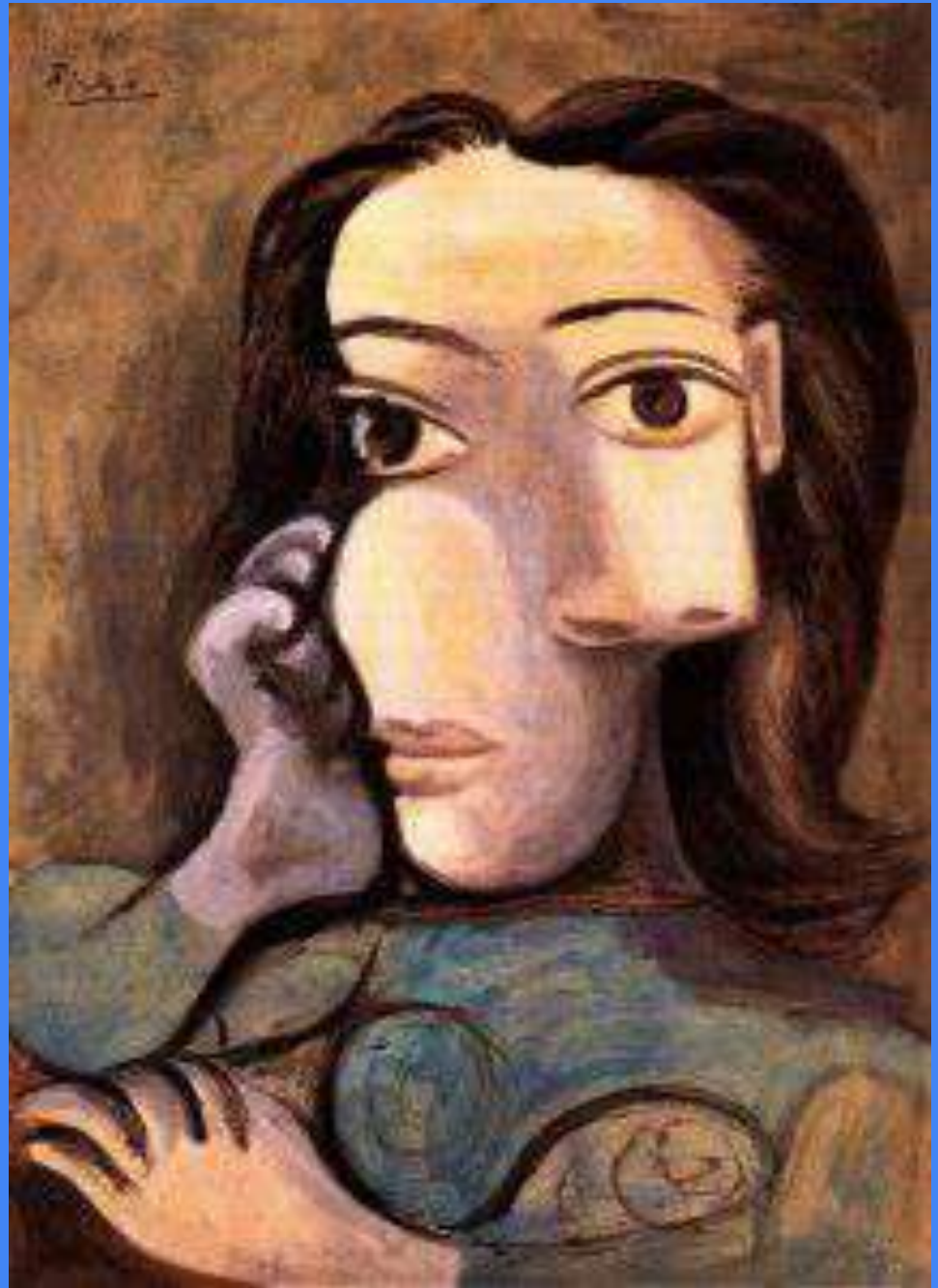

Using Color to Express Mood and Feeling

- ◆ The colors you choose to use in your portrait can tell the viewer more about you
- ◆ Colors are good to express how you are feeling or set a mood

Red

Excitement, energy, passion, love, desire, speed, strength, power, heat, aggression, danger, fire, blood, war, violence, all things intense and passionate, sincerity, happiness (Only in Japan)



Pink

symbolizes love and
romance, caring, calm
tenderness, and acceptance



Yellow

signifies joy, happiness, betrayal, optimism, idealism, imagination, hope, sunshine, summer, gold, philosophy, dishonesty, cowardice, jealousy, covetousness, deceit, illness, hazard and friendship.



Blue:

Peace, tranquility, cold, calm, stability, harmony, unity, trust, truth, confidence, conservatism, security, cleanliness, order, loyalty, sky, water, technology, depression, appetite suppressant.



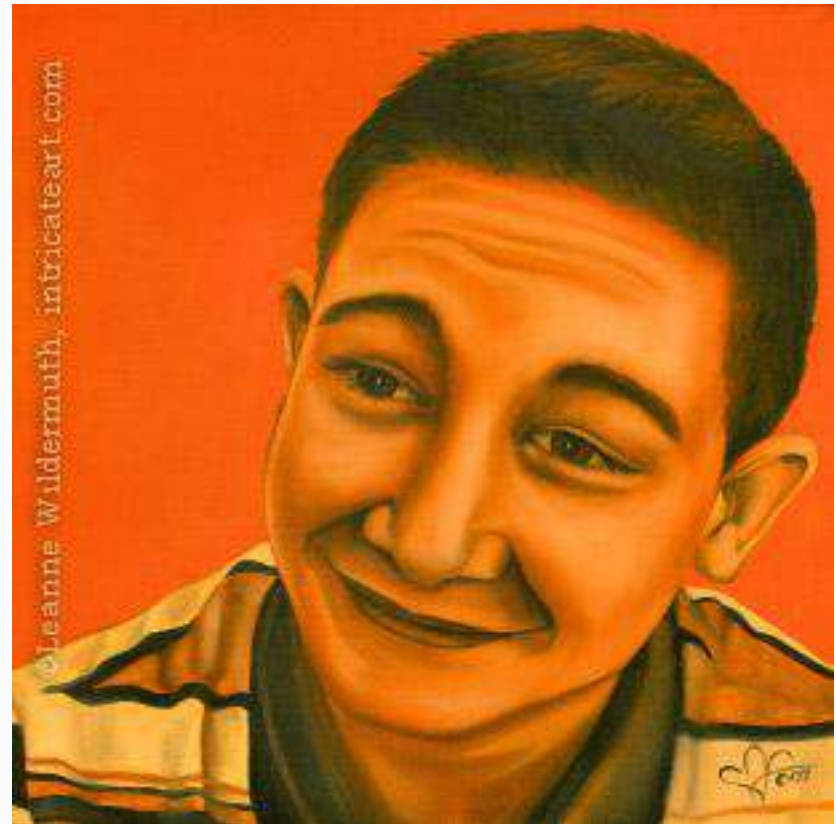
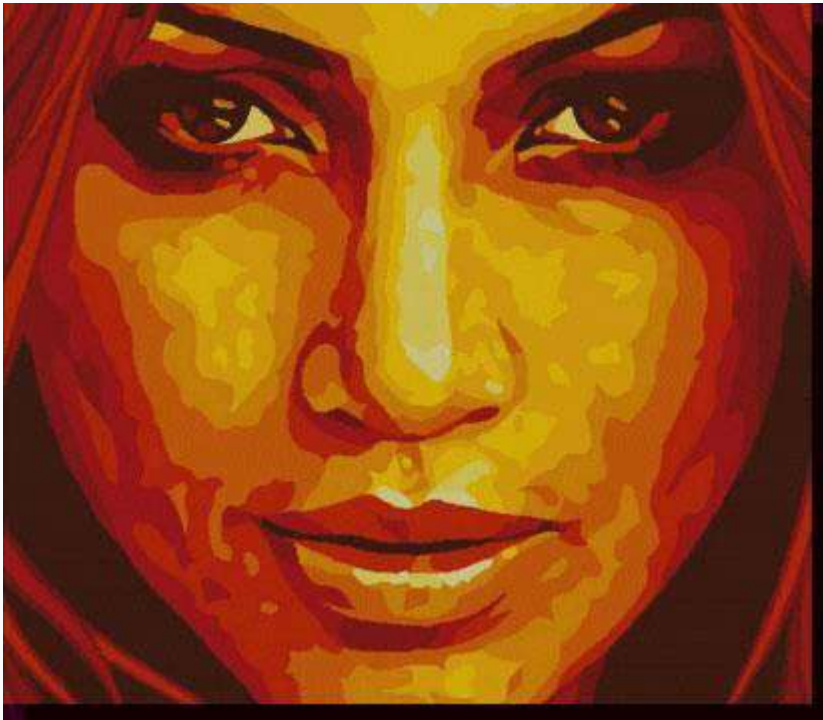
Purple:

Royalty, nobility, spirituality, ceremony, mysterious, transformation, wisdom, enlightenment, cruelty, honor, arrogance, mourning, temperance.



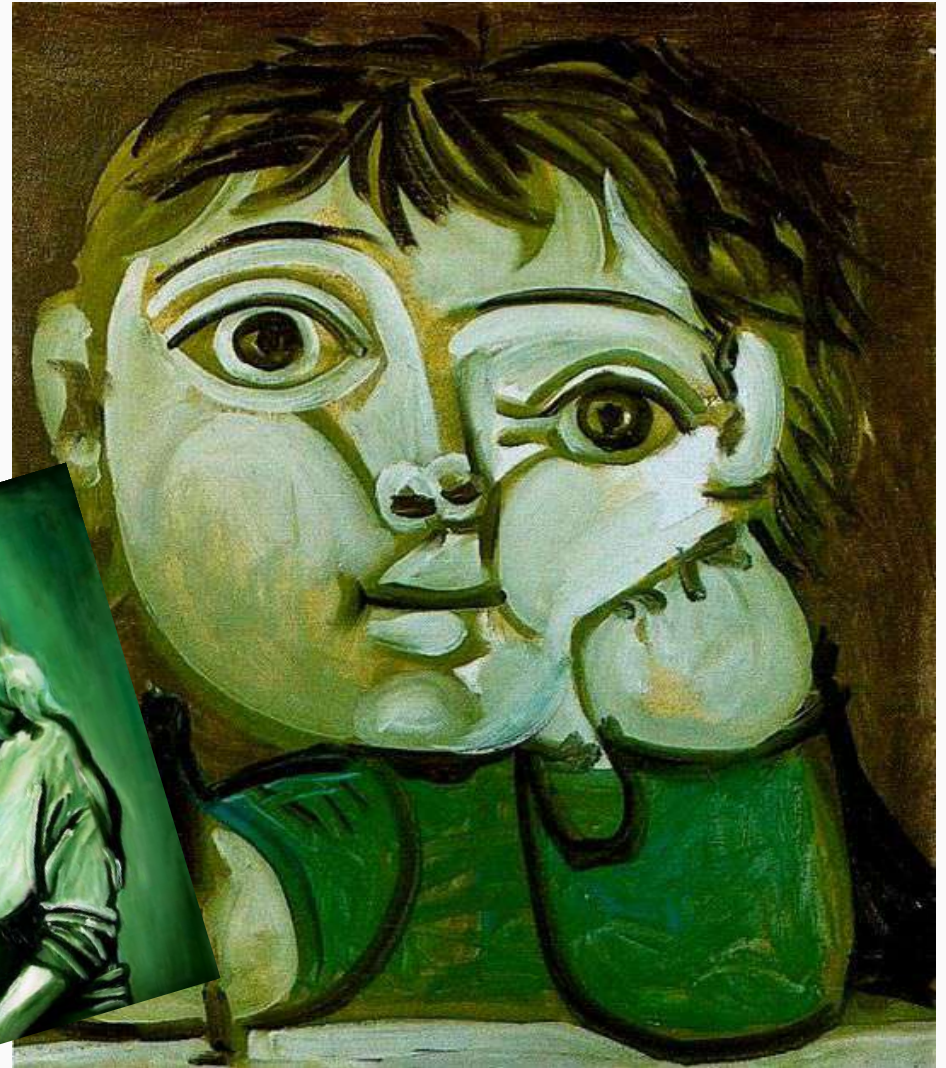
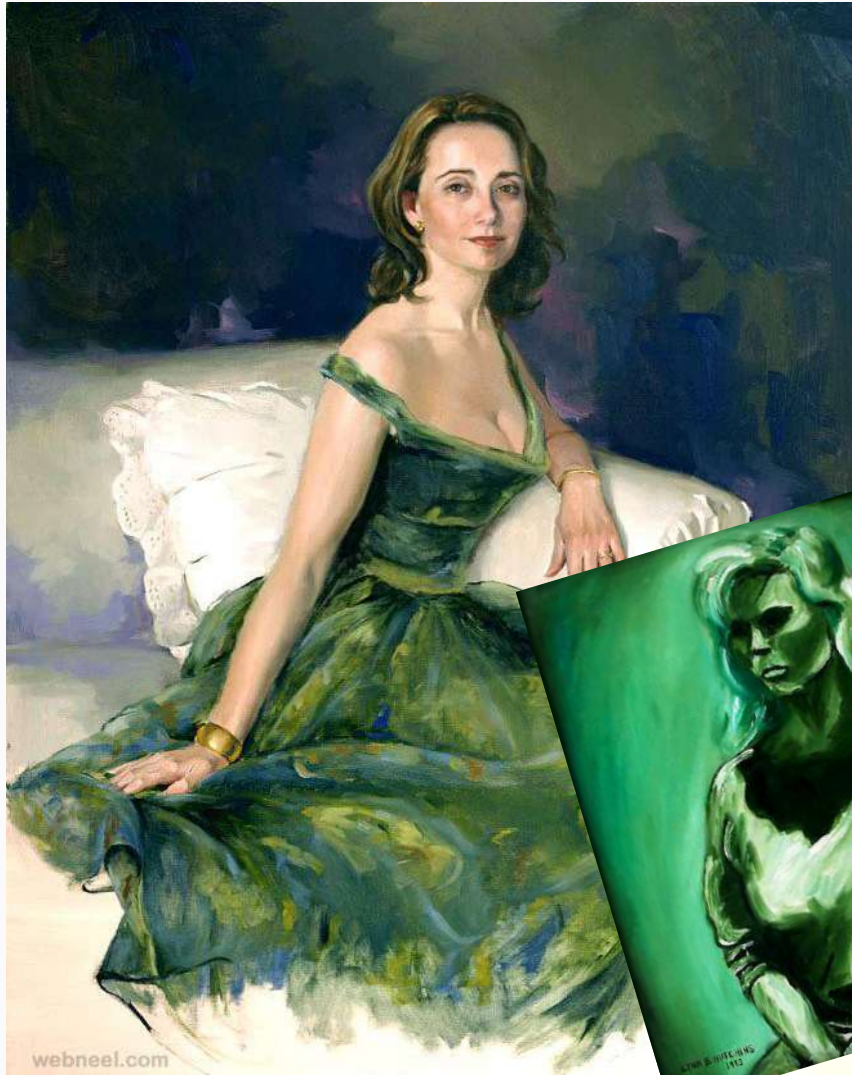
Orange:

Energy, balance, enthusiasm, warmth, vibrant, expansive, flamboyant, demanding of attention.



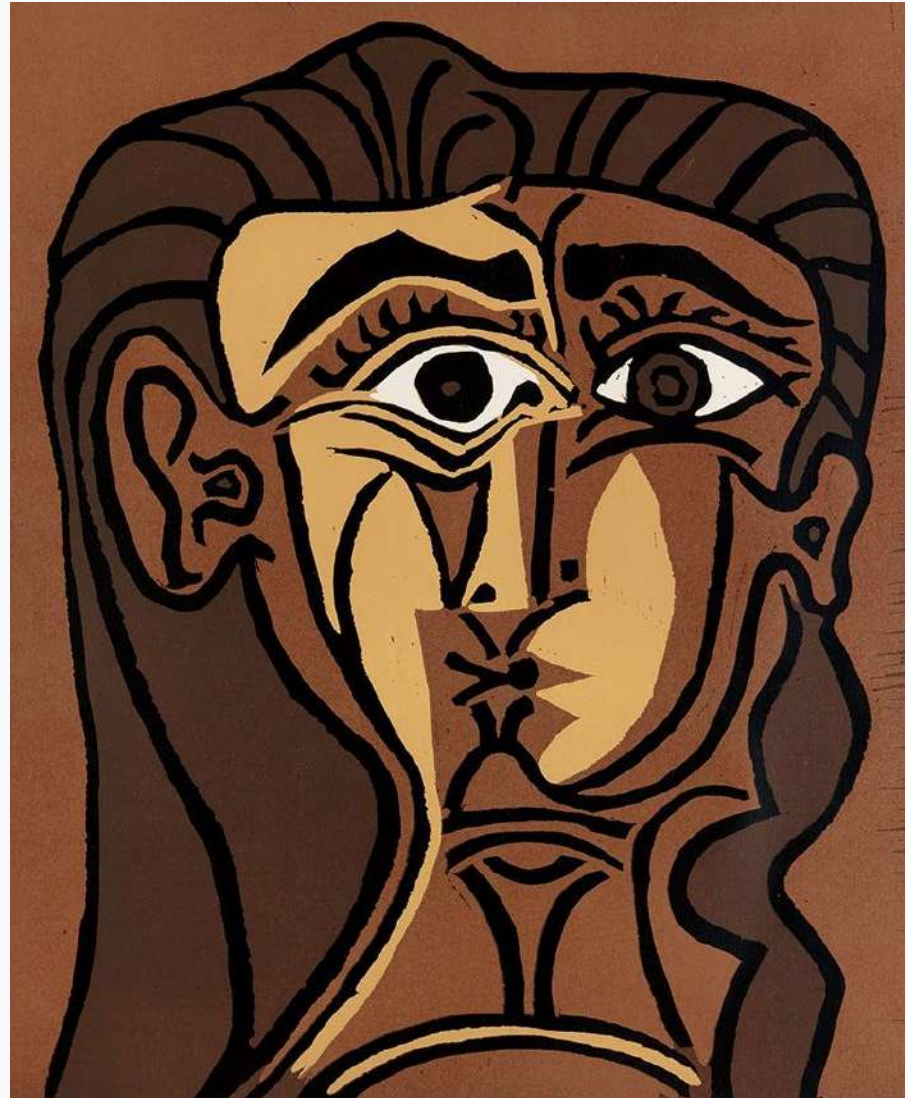
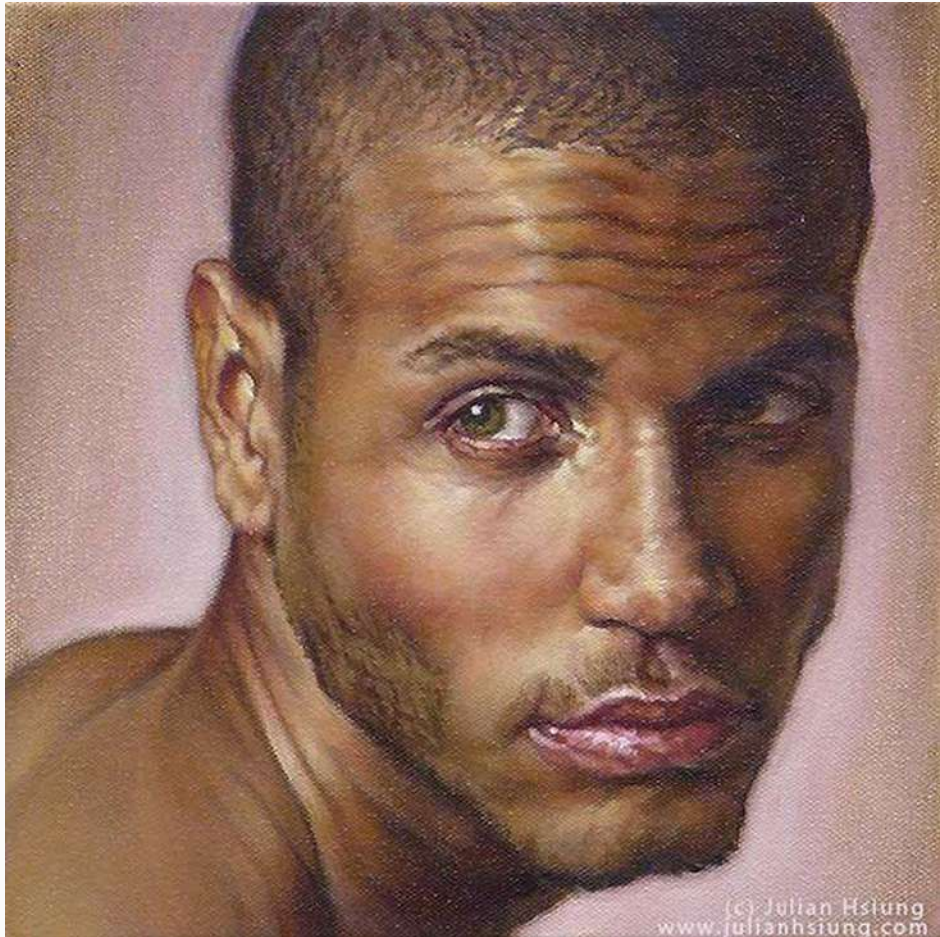
Green:

Nature, environment, healthy, good luck, renewal, youth, spring, generosity, fertility, jealousy, service, inexperience, envy, misfortune, vigor.



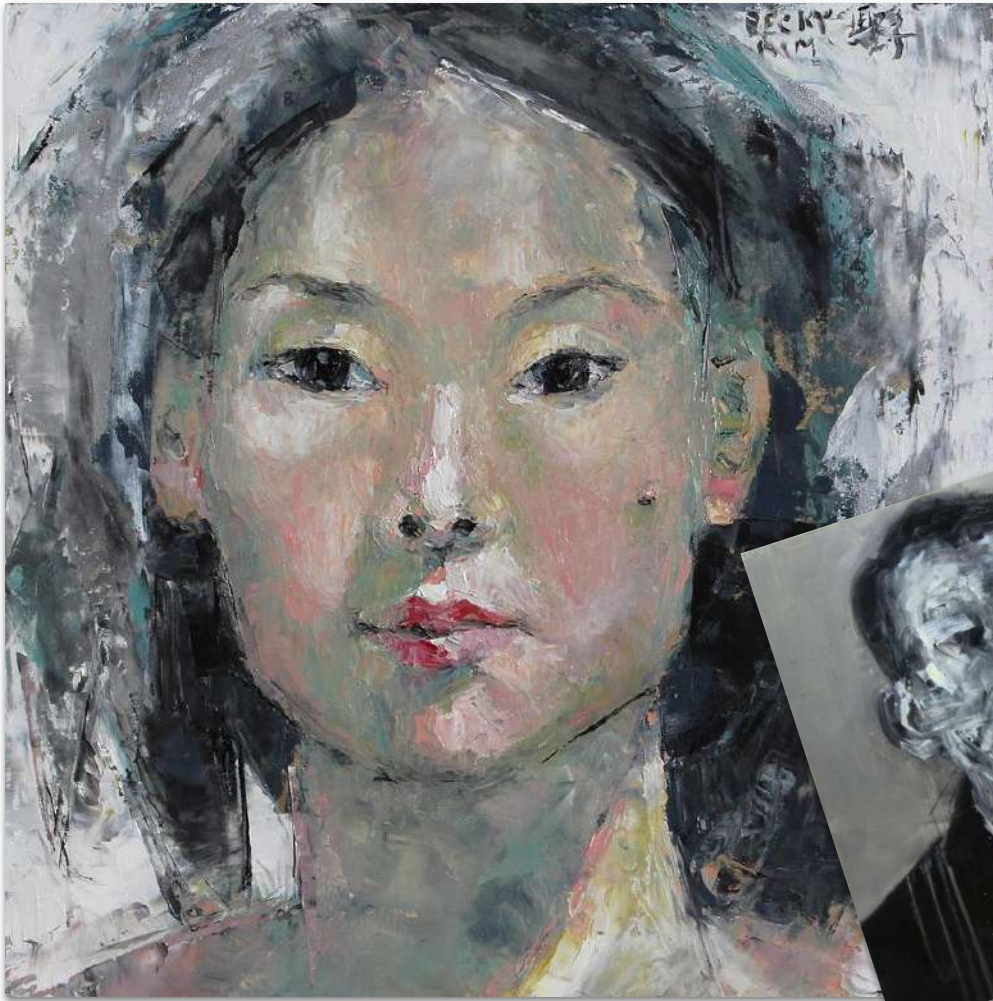
Brown:

Earth, stability, hearth, home, comfort, outdoors, reliability, endurance, simplicity, and comfort.



Gray:

Security, reliability, intelligence, staid, modesty, dignity, maturity, solid, conservative, practical, old age, sadness, boring. Silver symbolizes calm.



White:

Reverence, purity, birth, simplicity, cleanliness, peace, humility, precision, innocence, youth, winter, snow, good, sterility, marriage (Western cultures), death (Eastern cultures), cold, clinical.



Black:

Power, sexuality, sophistication, formality, elegance, wealth, mystery, fear, evil, unhappiness, depth, style, sadness, remorse, anger, anonymity, underground, good technical color, mourning, death (Western cultures), austerity, detachment.

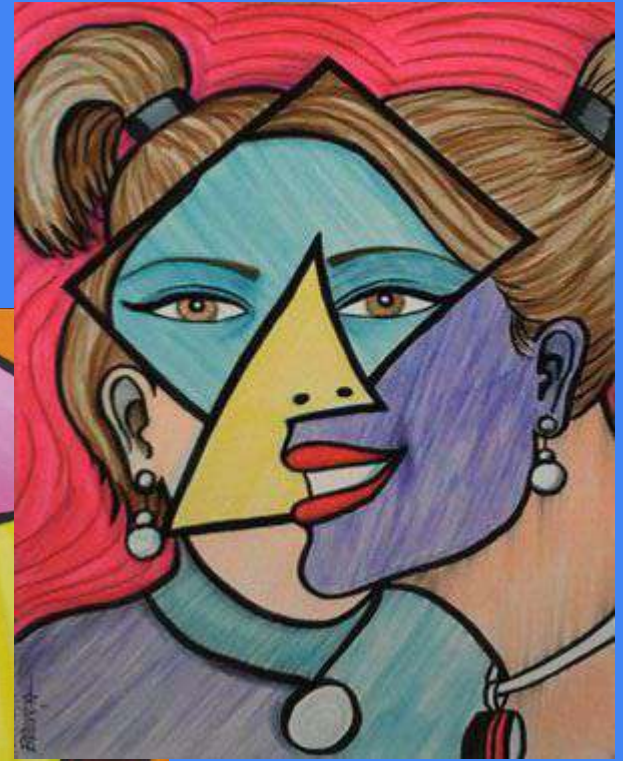

Assignment: Cubism Self-Portrait-Pablo Picasso

1. You will be creating a self-portrait based on the work of Pablo Picasso using **Layered Color Pencil**; Drawing should show influences from Picasso's cubist period
2. You will **lightly** draw a contour line cubism self-portrait drawing using a number two pencil; Head to shoulders required.
3. You will have an understanding of Picasso and Cubism.
4. Colors should represent and express your mood, feelings, and self; use colors to express mood, you will be expected to explain your color choice later
5. You will make use of a minimum of **5 colors**; excluding Black and White
6. All paper needs to be filled in with Layered Color Pencil
7. Black and White should not take up more than $\frac{1}{8}$ th of your paper
8. When layering color pencils use complementary colors to create darker areas within your portrait.
9. All colors need to be layered, solid, and blended
