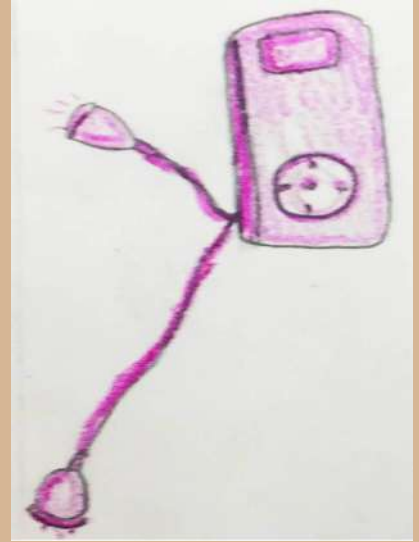

# History of Illuminated Manuscripts

An illuminated manuscript is a manuscript in which the text is supplemented with such decoration as initials, borders, pictures and miniature images.



Illuminated manuscripts were first **created** in the sixth century and popularized across Europe into the 15<sup>th</sup> century.

The earliest **illuminated manuscript** is the Vergilius Augusteus of the 4th century CE which exists in seven pages of what must have been a much larger book of Virgil's works

It centralized the command of Middle Age churches and monasteries, It symbolized a new era of textual literacy, spiritual devotion, and material culture.





The term illuminated manuscript meaning in both the common usage and modern scholarship, refers to any decorated or illustrated manuscript from Western traditions.

Comparable Mesoamerican works are described as painted.

*Mesoamerica: A pre-Columbian cultural region extending from the southern part of Mexico to an area that comprises some parts of the countries of Central America*





Comparable Far Eastern illuminated manuscripts works are also described as painted.

In addition, Islamic manuscripts may be referred to as illuminated, illustrated or painted, though they essentially use very similar to the the same techniques as Western works.

- The photograph transforms something literal into something abstract**

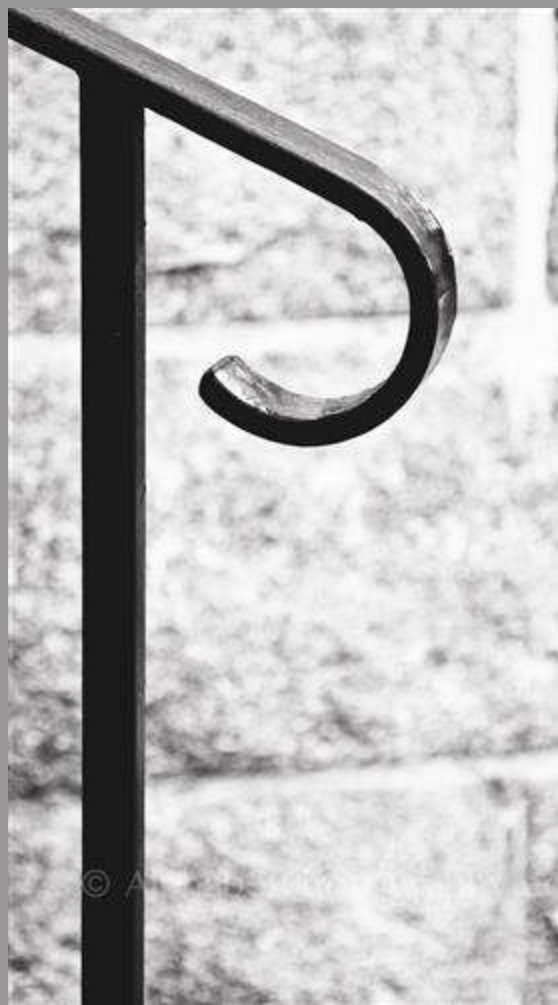


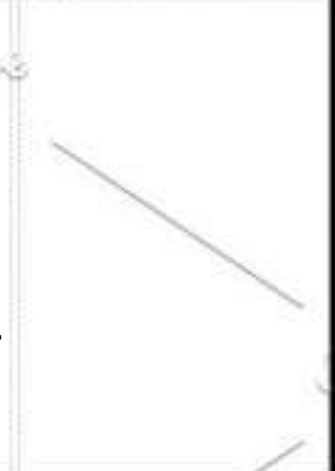
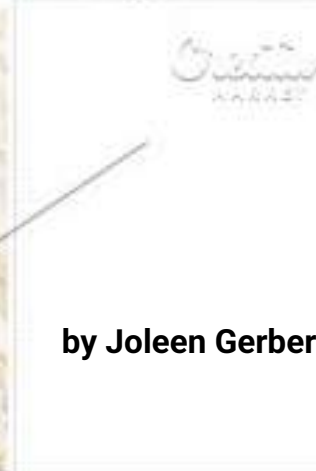

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# Picture Word Art



The student will apply elements of art and principles of design to create a well thought out composition. The composition should including the following, to express meaning in your work of art:

1. Foreground, Midground and Background
2. Value: the relative degree of lightness to darkness and/or

Color: harmonious chromatic relationships

1. Space: positive, negative
2. Balance: equal visual weight
3. Emphasis: focal point, dominance
