Dear Pirate Community,

Happy New Year! Students and teachers have been working diligently this week preparing for exams next week. All semester long courses will have a final exam next week. Yearlong classes will take both their Aday and Bday midyear assessments during the exam block. First period is on Monday with second period review session starting at 12:30. Second period exam is on Tuesday with third period review session that afternoon. Third period exam is on Wednesday with fourth period review session that afternoon. Fourth period exam is on Thursday morning and will end at about 12:30. PRHS Administration and staff strongly encourage all students to attend their review sessions from 12:30 - 2:15 each day through Wednesday. Students will have quiet study time from 2:15 until regular dismissal. If you as their parent choose to have your child dismissed after exams your child must turn in a note PRIOR to the exam starting with their name and dismissal option (12:30 or 2:15) listed, along with a valid number that we can verify the note. We cannot accept phone calls or email requests to dismiss. If a note is not sent in the child cannot be dismissed. Again - it is our strong preference that students spend the review session at school studying so we respectfully ask that you do not ask for them to be dismissed early. The same rule about a dismissal note will apply to Thursday when exams end. We will have community activities for those students staying at school until regular dismissal on Thursday. Friday is a day for any student who missed their exam to come to school to make it up. All students are welcome at school but due to the make up testing they will not be with their regular course teacher that day.

Monday 1/20 we have off from school to honor the Martin Luther King Jr Holiday. Tuesday there is no school for students. Wednesday 1/22 is the first day of second Semester. Students will start in their Advisory class where they will receive their schedule and then they will proceed to their first period class. We will have our second semester safety assemblies with students during the week of January 27th.

Fall sports are going strong with basketball vs Rocky River tonight, swimming at their conference meet tonight and wrestling at Piedmont tomorrow. Additionally the Band will host the South Central District Band Auditions and we are honored to be approved to host!

Students exempt from a Teacher-Made exam are not required to attend the Review or Exam Session for that course.

Friday, January 17 is a makeup exam day – students needing to make up an exam should report to school by 8:00 to start.

Final Exam Info Continued

Type of Exams: We have four types of exams at the end of each semester – EOC, NC Finals, CTE State Assessment, and Teacher-Made. Teachers will address which type of exam their students will take.

Exam Exemptions for Teacher-Made Exams ONLY:

High School students will not be required to take a teacher-made final exam in a course in the following situations:

- The student has an average of 90 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 2 unexcused absences in the class; or
- The student has an average of 80 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 1 unexcused absence in the class.

Attendance: Attendance during exam days is required for all students, for both exam sessions and review sessions (only students who are excused from exam and review sessions for a course are those who are exempt). Our normal school hours apply, but the schedule and lunch times are adjusted. January 17 is an important day for any students who have missed an exam earlier in the week due to illness. We regret that family vacation plans are not excused, and students cannot take exams early. We apologize that any requests for exceptions cannot be honored.

Testing Window: All exam testing must be completed between January 13 and January 17. This is true for ALL types of exams: EOC, NC Final Exams, CTE State Assessments, and Teacher-Made.

Score Results: All high school exams count 25% of a student's grade for the semester.

Exam review: All teachers are expected to help students with review during class time and to distribute a review guide to students prior to testing. Students should begin organizing and reviewing material.

Academic Integrity: Please remind students of the need to prepare well for the exams and to make sure that they make ethical decisions when taking exams. The penalty for cheating of any kind is a "0" on a final exam.

Students will be required to turn in cell phones during testing sessions. If they do not want to do this, they should not bring their cell phone into the school.

Early Dismissals During Testing Week: NO student may be dismissed during the four hour testing window. NO notes will be accepted for this. In order to best support the success of all of our students - ALL students are required to attend the Teacher-Led Review Session, but may leave prior to the Student Study Time with a documented Parent Note. ALL parent notes must be given to the exam teacher prior to the exam starting. NO notes will be accepted via email or phone call during exam week. Parent Notes will be verified for dismissal as needed. If the note cannot be verified, it will not be approved.

2020 Weddington Optimist Computer Scholarship-- This scholarship is open to high school seniors who will be graduating in the Spring 2020. Seniors do not have to be enrolled to a 2 or 4-year higher education institution in the fall of 2020. North Carolina School of Science and Math (NCSSM) offers summer programs for students who are rising 5th-graders through high school seniors. With specialized coursework in areas such as artificial intelligence, biomedical sciences, and engineering, students have the opportunity to engage in real-world, hands-on experiences. Accelerator courses for 10th - 12th graders are conducted over three weeks. The first two weeks of each course take place virtually, at the student's own pace. The third week of each course takes place on campus, either in Durham or Brevard, NC. Register by February 1, 2020 to receive \$100 off tuition.
