

Black Death Simulation

In the late 1300s, a plague swept through Europe.

Spread by infected fleas that lived on rodents, the Black Death probably killed one-third of the population.

As people traveled, the disease spread.
Each of you will be taking a journey
through Europe in the 1300's!

Each player will take a turn making the entire journey. The first player starts in England. They roll the die. A roll of 1, 2, or 3 means they stay one night in that place. A roll of 4, 5, or 6 means they stay two nights.

Without looking in the bag, they must pull out one or two tiles for the nights they'll be staying.

Blue tiles mean they are safe from the plague and are able to continue on the journey.

Red tiles mean they are now infected with the plague. They still will continue to the next 2 places, but they will be spreading the disease before dying. After the first person, yellow tiles also mean infected!

Put the blue and red tiles back in the bag after each place.

If a player is infected with the disease, they roll the die in the next 2 places. A roll of 1, 2, or 3 means they place a yellow tile in the bag. A roll of 4, 5, or 6 means they place two yellow tiles in the bag. The yellow tiles will show how many people they have infected. After the second tow, they will die of the plague, and their journey is over.

The more players that contract the plague, the more the plague is spread.

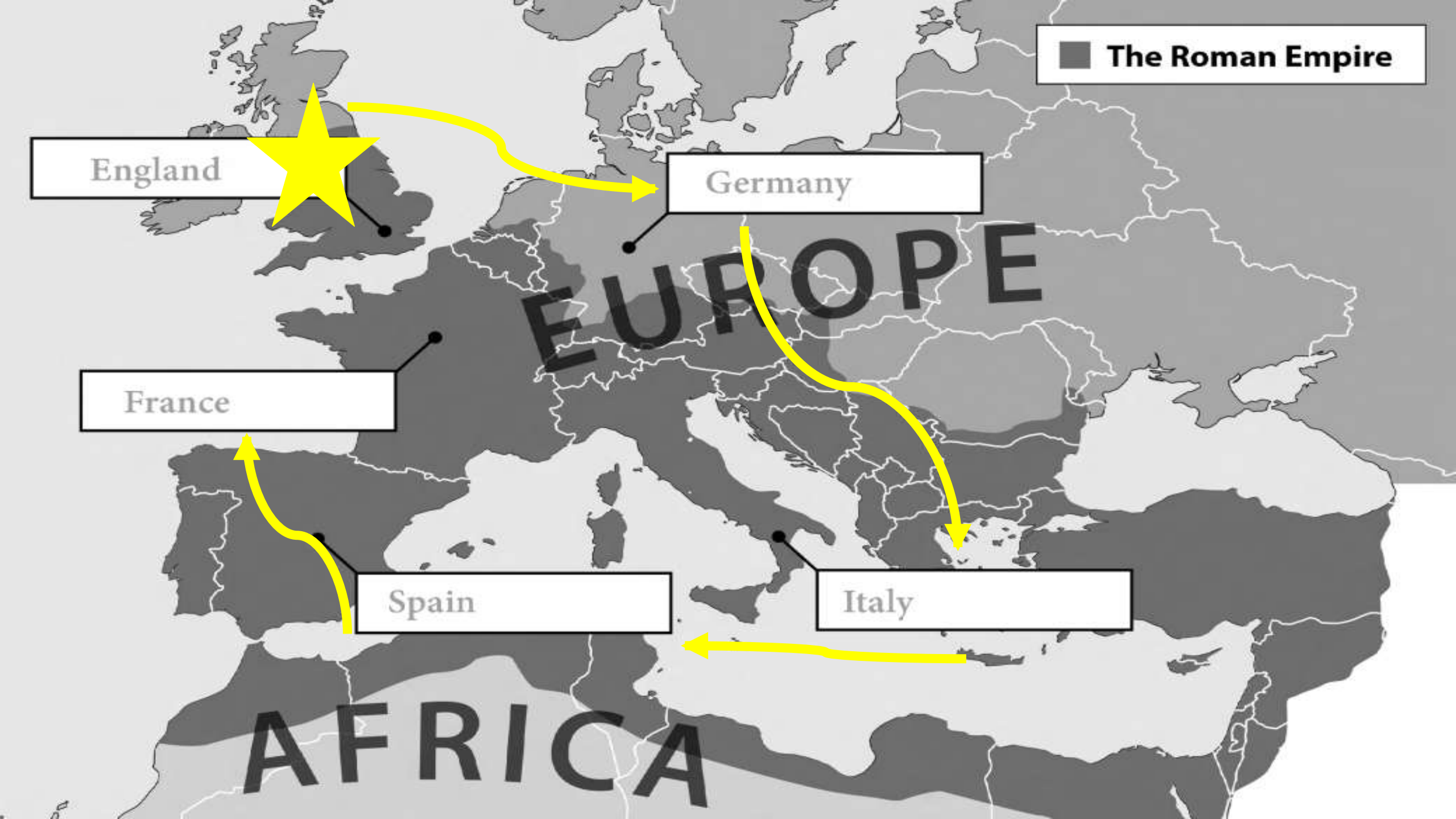
