2. What is the CONFLICT , or problem, in this story? Name both sides of the conflict; in other words, state the two
"forces" that oppose each other. Finally, explain the source of the tension, or drama, between these two forces.
3. This story relies on a SYMBOL, which is an object that represents an idea. What is the symbol, and what does it
represent, or symbolize? Explain your answer.
4. A. In a word or two, what is the <u>THEME</u> (main idea) of this story? Check the <u>CLIMAX</u> . Usually, the characters'
realization at the climax is based on the theme. B. What is the author, Leo Lionni, trying to say about this theme? In
other words, what's his <u>THEME MESSAGE</u> ?
