School-wide Instructional Focus



Balanced Literacy

During the first semester of the 2021-2022 school year, teachers have been working to improve the instructional process by focusing on literacy strategies. The goal is for our students to become fluent readers, writers, and communicators. Teachers have worked to perfect the four components of the Balanced Literacy Framework which include: Word Study, Shared Reading, Independent Reading, and Writing. Dr. Craig Drennon has provided support to our teachers to guide them through the instructional process to better serve our students. Throughout his time at Palmetto, Dr. Drennon has conducted model lessons, provided instructional coaching, and hosted professional development for teachers throughout the district. Teachers and students work within the structured framework to focus on vocabulary, fluency, and writing.

Into Math

Into Math is a new math resource designed to better support students in learning math concepts. Teachers have implemented the district's instructional framework, that provides time for teachers to extend lessons and student learning through guided groups. During this time, teachers target students for instructional support to build mathematical skills. Our district office has provided a great deal of support to our staff in our efforts to improve instruction.



Math Intervention

Our students receive additional support in mathematics from our new Math Interventionist, Ms. Brooke Kirkland. As a former student of Palmetto Middle and graduate of Mullins High School, Ms. Kirkland understands the challenges our students face and has taken proactive measures to support them. Each week, Ms. Kirkland meets with students to provide small group instruction on skills students may lack, and she reinforces mathematical skills that need to be strengthened. Ms. Kirkland works with teachers to plan lessons that engage students, while focusing on guided groups. You can also find her supporting in class instruction in order to reach a greater population of students.

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP)

Students have taken the second MAP assessment in reading and math. MAP tests are computerized assessments that measure the amount of growth students have made within the content area. Questions vary for each student based on how accurately they respond. We use the test data to project how students will perform on SC Ready.



The table below highlights students' MAP data from the Fall and Winter 2021 assessments. The data represents the percentage (s) of students who took both the Fall and Winter MAP Assessments who met their yearly growth goal. Although we are moving in the right direction; we still have a lot of work to do to get students to make academic growth and perform on grade level. Also, on the market are THC products that are packaged as popular candy, chips, cookies, and cereal. Parents read labels carefully, on common items such as Gummy worms/bears, chips or Lucky Charms Cereal for example. Good products are being rebranded to entice younger kids with names such as Stoney Patch Kids, Doweedos, and Munchables to name a few. Some even contain Fentanyl which is highly addictive and lethal at high doses. We have not observed this in our school setting. However, knowledge is power. Let's work together to keep our kids safe.
