






The **SAT** tests reasoning and verbal abilities and is designed to assess students' academic readiness for college.



National Merit Scholars

The National Merit Scholarship Program is an annual academic competition among high school students for recognition and college scholarships that began in 1955.

I.3 million students from 22,000 entered the National Merit Scholarship Program

Take PSAT & NMSQT in Grade II as an initial screening

They must also meet elite level academic requirements through senior year proving greatest potential for success in rigorous college studies and beyond

Less than 1% become finalists


- **SAT/ACT Test Optional** remains in place for now, created huge increase in applications to highly selective schools leads to even lower acceptance rates.
- Popularity of the Common Application large increase in applications (7.5%+), easy to apply and number of applications rose, more schools joined CA (Rutgers)
- State/Public Universities saw large increases overall, in-state tuition is less than private, students staying closer to home
- **Deferrals and Waitlists** getting larger due to strong early applicants
- International Applicants continues to increase, pay full tuition
- Demonstrated Interest more important ED and EA, college tours, online engagement is often tracked
- Covid Effect continues... reflected in class of 2021- 2023 applications, admissions to selective schools remains challenging and unpredictable.
 Students need a balanced list of schools on their application list.





National Merit Scholars

- Requirements
 - Enrollment as a high school student on track for graduation,
 - Take the PSAT/NMSQT in grade 11; and
 - Attend high school in the U.S, District of Columbia, or U.S. commonwealths and territories; or meet the U.S. citizenship requirements for students attending high school outside the U.S.

National Merit (cont)

- Over 1.6 million students in about 22,000 high schools enter the National Merit Scholarship Program each year.
- About 50,000 entrants qualify for program recognition
- About 8,500 outstanding students receive scholarships

National Merit (cont)


- Less than I percent of the nation's high school graduating seniors qualify as Semi Finalists each year.
- The Semi Finalists have the opportunity to advance in the competition for about 7,250 Merit Scholarship awards.

National Merit (cont)


- In order for a Semifinalist to qualify as a Finalist, they must
 - Continue to meet all requirements
 - Be enrolled in their last year of high school
 - Have a record of consistently high academic performance
 - Complete the NMSC Online Scholarship Application
 - Take the SAT or ACT and earn scores consistent with PSAT/NMSQT
 - Provide additional documentation, including submission of a personal essay.
 - About 95% of Semi Finalists qualify as Finalists.
