Typography

- See typefaces everyday on signs, posters, computers, cell phones, etc.
- Typeface AKA font
- Add EMOTION and FLAVOR to the words
- Consider legibility (how easy it is to read)
- example – letters too close together would be difficult to read
 - **Kerning:** spacing letters in a sentence line
 - **Leading:** spacing between lines of type

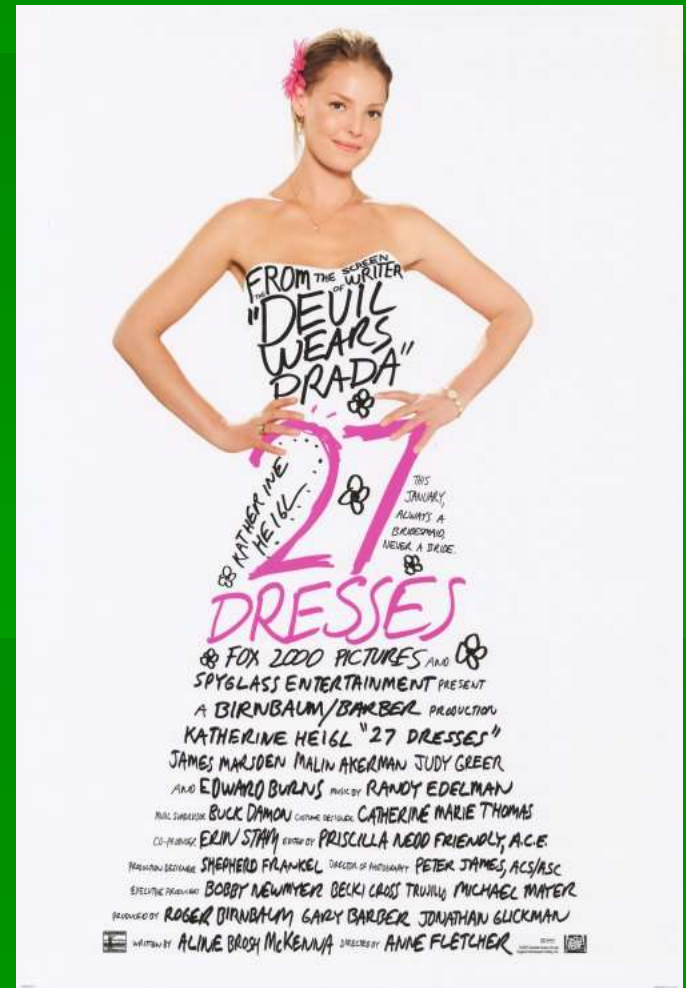

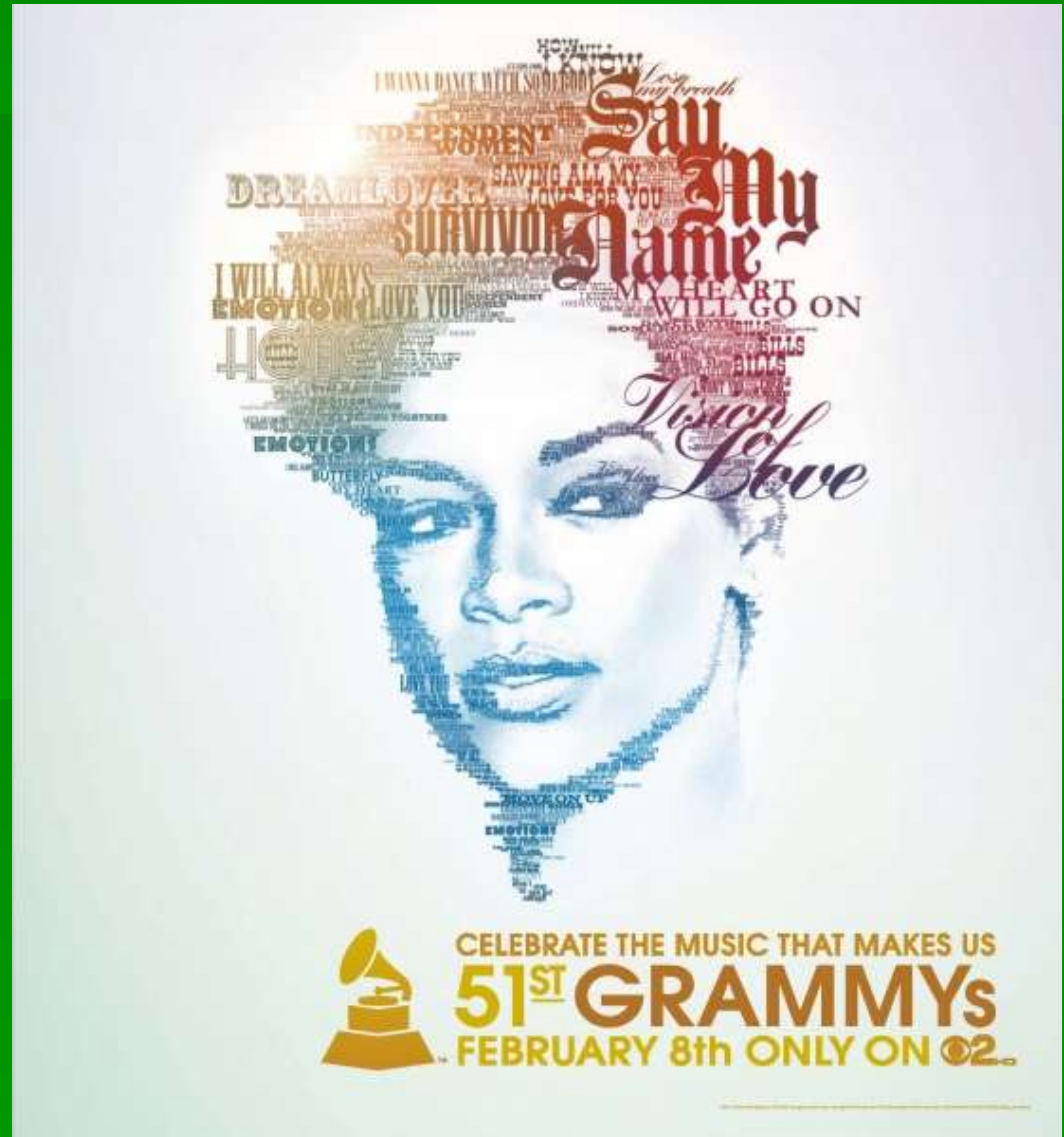
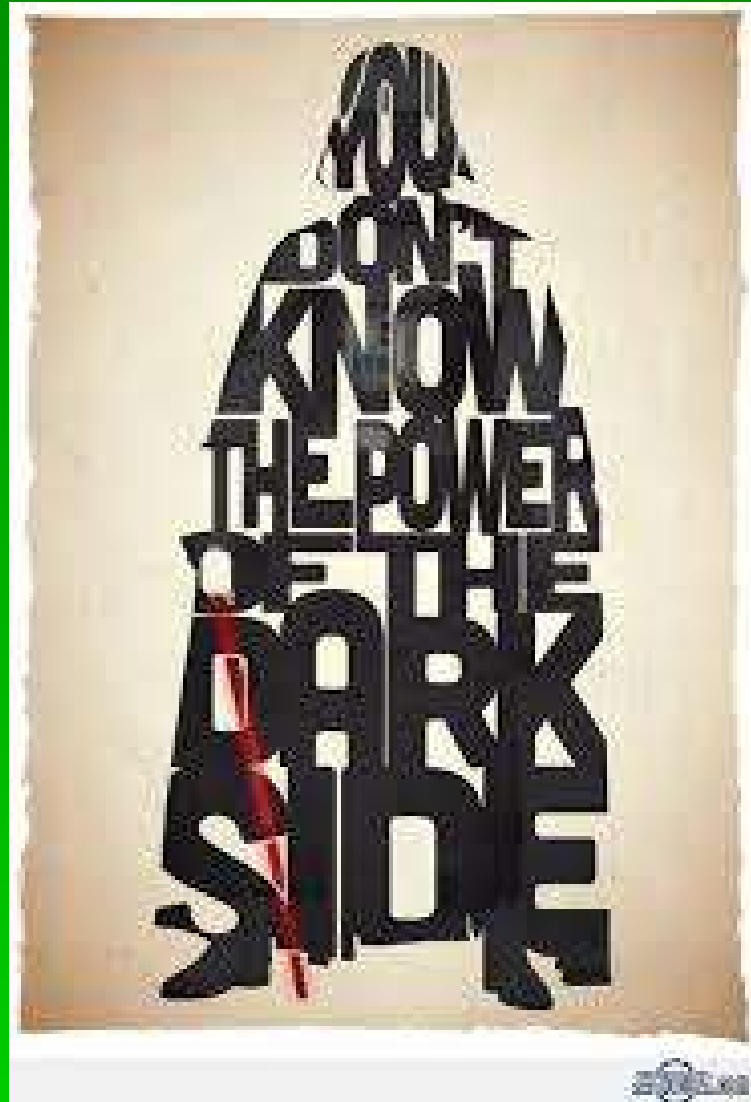

- How can type be manipulated or positioned to create a shape?



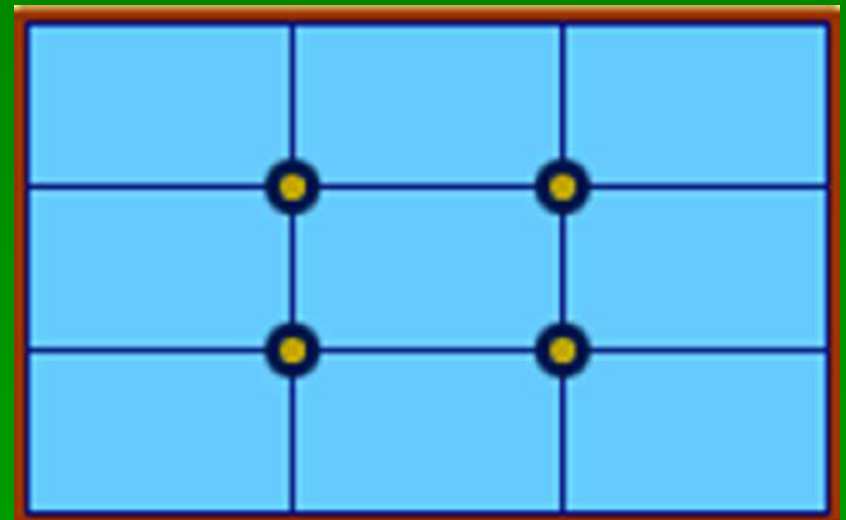

THE WORDS

Rule of Thirds

- Visually divide your composition into 1/3s from top to bottom and left to right.
- Avoid dividing your paper in 1/2

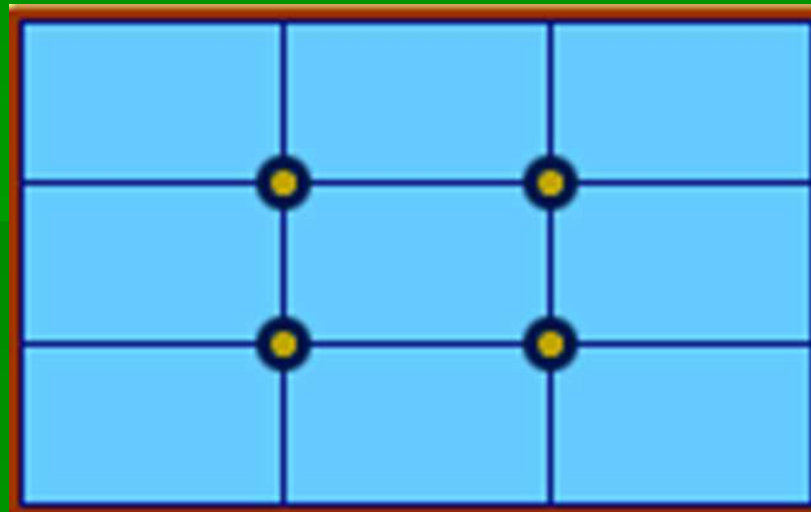


Rule of Thirds



Visual Magnets

- intersection of the rule of thirds line create visual magnets (yellow dots)
- eyes tends to rest here, place main subjects on or near these lines



Visual Magnets





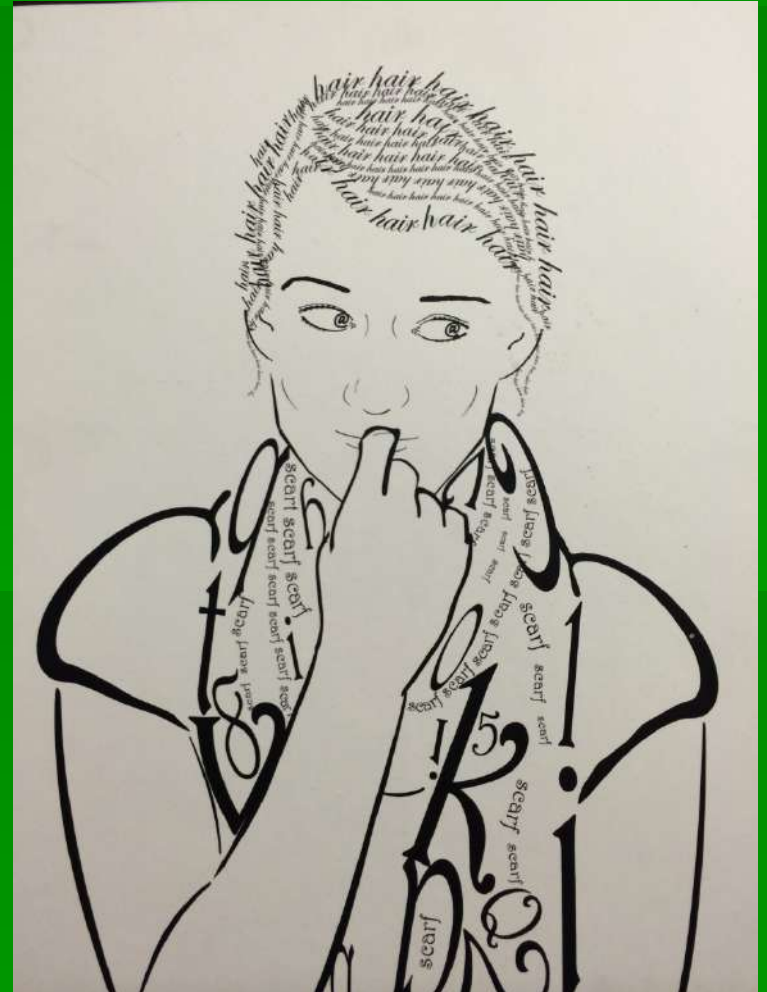
HOW TO BEGIN....

- Find a picture you'd like to use for your Type Portrait
 - Things to consider:
 - Rule of Thirds
 - Visual Magnets
 - how can you position your portrait inside the frame of the Illustrator Document in an interesting way?

NEXT...

- Once you have your picture selected, placed and positioned in your Illustrator Document you will.....
 - Rotates type vertically, horizontally, and diagonally to express an idea and fit the person's face
 - Pay close attention to arrangement and font styles you choose (BIG HAIR = BIG, BOLD FONT)
 - Overall creates an original image of a portrait using letters/keys on keyboard
 - **Be careful NOT to manipulate font so much that it doesn't look like a font anymore**

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Two approaches to this project....

1. Small letters positioned on top of one another to create value (again, I still need to see letters)

2. Large letters to form and shape the person's
Face/body
