




Can you beat the tallest tower?

← Not this one.


In your groups,

The Rules

In your groups, use the single pad of Post-it notes to create the tallest tower.

You only get one pad of Post-it notes (100).

You **MAY** cut, tear, fold, manipulate the paper however you want.

Your tower must be supported only by the Post-it notes.

You **MAY NOT** use anything except for Post-it notes to make your tower.

Your tower can only be built up, not hang from somewhere.
